Notice of New Voting Precinct.

TO THE ELECTORS OF RICHLAND TOWNSHIP, DECATUR COUNTY, IOWA.

You are hereby notified that, upon petition of the electors of Richland township, that the Board of Supervisors at the regular session on April 8, 1903, passed the following resolution in compliance with Section 1090, of the Code of 1897, to-wit:

That the township of Richland, Decatur county, Iowa, shall upon the compliance of Section 1092, be divided into two voting precincts to be named and boundaries defined as follows, to-wit:

That sections 1 to 24 inclusive of above named township, shall constitute one voting precinct, to be known as Westerville precinct, Richland township, Decatur county, Iowa, and

That sections 25 to 36 inclusive, of said above described township, to constitute one voting precinct, to be known as Grand River precinct, Richland township, Decatur county, Iowa.

You are hereby notified that at the General Election to be held on the 3d of November, 1903, and all succeeding elections, unless said precincts shall be legally changed, that the electors of said precincts are entitled to cast their ballots in said precincts as provided by law.

I, J. F. Gill, auditor of Decatur county Iowa, hereby certify that the above division and establishment of said voting precincts are correct and upon the third publication of the same in an official newspaper of said county, that said precincts will be officially established.
