F. A. Warner, manager of the Hiram Sibley estate in Ford county, Illinois, told the McLean county farmer's institute in 1903 his figures on sixty acres of corn. He counted the plowing, discing, harrowing, seed, planting, cultivating, thinning and cutting weeds and hauling. With a yield of forty bushels per acre, the corn would cost \$5 per acre; twenty-three cents per bushel to a tenant giving two-fifths rent, as on the Sibley farm. Counting the land worth \$80 per acre, the landlord's share cost him thirty-three cents per bushel. If the landlord raised the corn himself, with the same labor, it would cost him twenty-seven cents per bushel.
