Letter to The Reporter.

Beloit, Kas., June 5, 1904.
EDITOR REPORTER:—As I have been thinking of writing a letter for THE REPORTER I will endeavor to do so as it is a weekly visitor and we would not know how to get along without it. We left Deatur county in January, 1902, for Beloit, Kas., where we bought a fine farm in Center township. In 1902 we did not raise very much of a crop but in 1903 we got a big wheat and corn crop. We sold seven hundred and fifty dollars worth of grain off our farm and had enough left to do us. We had all the fruit we could use both years and some to spare and this year we can't use half of it. We have a better show for a crop this year than we had last year. We have had lots of rain all spring. Wheat is all headed out and waist high and corn is from 8 to 12 inches high. The alfalfa is ready to cut now, being the largest crop ever known in the county. Since I came here land has advanced from \$5 to \$10 per acre. On the 2d of this month we had a rain that raised the creek through our farm over 6 feet in two hours. If any of THE REPORTER readers want to know anything about this country and will write to me I will answer at once.


