Less than 100 votes decided the election in Maryland. The democrats elected seven electors and the republicans one. The lesson taught is the value of a vote.

Madame Janauschek, the famous Bohemian actress is dead at the Brunswick home Amityville, L. I., where she has been cared for by actors for the past four months. She was 74 years old.

The department of Washington has declared guessing contests to be lotteries and where the mails are used, to be a violation of the postal laws. The guesses on the number of admissions to the World's Fair and the number of votes cast for the president in 1904, are cited as violations of postal regulations.

Acting Secretary Oliver directed the discharge "without honor," of Private John T. Smith of the hospital corps, stationed at Fort Mott, N. Y., who is said to have married a negress, and whose discharge was recommended by General Grant, commanding the department of the east.

There were 46,621 less votes cast in Iowa at the recent election than were cast in 1900. There must be a battle on to get out the vote. There were 3,928 less republican votes this year than in 1900, but there were 50,430 less democratic ballots. The prohibition and people's party both show increase, and 13,917 socialist votes were cast in 1904 against none in 1900.

An administration official declares that it is all nonsense about men refusing cabinet positions and congressional nominations on the sole score that it is too expensive to live in Washington. "Nine-tenths of them," he says, "not only live within their salaries, but save money. Some spend a great deal more than they receive from the government, and they can well afford to do so. Good formal dinners and similar entertainments can be given in the capital as cheaply as in any other place and at less cost than in many large cities."

Professor Holden, of the Iowa Agricultural college at Ames, who conducted a very successful campaign in favor of carefully selected seed corn last spring, proposes to continue the work and to enlarge his circuit next spring. He says there is a great loss to the farmers each year, because poor seed is used. And he has no trouble in proving his proposition. Surely the farmer ought to devote as much care and attention to the seed before it is planted as he does after it has been hidden away beneath the ground.

The Waterloo Reporter, referring to the fact that the two new constitutional amendments were adopted by a minority vote, says there will be general agreement that the law is loose in permitting a minority of the electors to decide a question of such importance as amending the constitution. The Reporter is unable to advance any explanation why the voters failed to vote on the amendments and suggests that as there is no recourse to compel an expression, that's where the Iowa law fails to safeguard the constitution from tinkering. "Some state laws," the Reporter adds "require a majority of all votes cast at an election to amend the constitution."

An increased deficiency of 92.58 per cent over the previous year is shown by the financial statement for the postal services, incorporated in the annual report of E. C. Madden, third assistant postmaster general, for the fiscal year ended July 26, 1904. The report shows, however, the increase in expenditures is on account of the rural free delivery service. Were it not for this extraordinary expenditure the postal service now would be about self sustaining. The total receipts from all sources for the fiscal year were \$143,582,624, and the total expenditures \$152,362,116, leaving a deficiency of \$8,779,492. The deficiency for the previous year was \$4,560,044.

### Our New Judge.

Hon. H. K. Evans will today take the oath of office and assume the duties of District Judge for this judicial district. Judge Evans had fully intended not to qualify until December 31st, thus permitting Judge Miller to serve until the end of the year but in looking up the requirements of the law and after communicating with the secretary of State and Attorney General it was determined that under the law a person elected to fill a vacancy must qualify within ten days after the issuance of his certificate of election. Judge Evans certificate of election was dated Nov. 30th, so it becomes necessary for him to qualify at once. Judge Evans regrets that he is compelled to qualify before the close of the year but should he fail to qualify at this time a vacancy would be created which would have to be filled by appointment.—Corydon Times-Republican.
