

Hermit Leaves Hidden Fortune.

George Munson who has resided in this county for more than a quarter of a century is dead. For twenty-five years he had lived the life of a hermit on a farm north of Murray.

Christmas eve he went to the stable to attend to feeding his horses. He first fell down between the horses managing to raise himself up he got outside the stable. After closing the door he fell to the ground where he remained out in the cold all night, and until Christmas day at 11 a. m. when he was found by a neighbor and carried to the home of Frank Howell, Dr. C. O. Freel was hurriedly called. He at once gave it as his opinion that he would not survive the shock of cold, exhaustion and old age. He passed away Friday. Before dying he told them to hunt up his money around the house. Ninety-five dollars in five dollar gold pieces, musty with age were found in an old tin baking powder can. Over \$100 dollars was found between the leaves of an old code. Small wads and little rolls of bills were found in boxes and trunks some of it faded with age, until over \$1200 was secured and brought to the bank in Murray.

He was the owner of 200 acres of farming land. A nephew came from Missouri to help take care of him. The neighbors carefully nursed him and he received every attention until his death.

His remains were taken to Creston Sunday for burial. Rev. A. A. Thompson conducted the funeral services Sunday morning.

A unique character has passed away. Yet he was a man who has the sympathy of this community.—Osceola Democrat.

Electric Line Proposed?

One day last week Mr. Grunter Ballew of Princeton, was in town talking to our people about the matter of establishing an electric line across the country.

Mr. Ballew's idea is to begin at Princeton and build a line to Bethany via Cainsville and Mt. Moriah, and later to extend the line east from Princeton and west from Bethany. He said that he had spent two weeks searching for a route between Princeton and Cainsville and had found one that would be practicable and easy to build. While here he took notes of the topography of the country with a view of getting into the depot and how to cross the river. His idea seemed to be to cross the river on the wagon bridge and follow the main road to Mt. Moriah, and if this is done but little grading would be necessary. He is walking over the route, and left here for Mt. Moriah.

The News does not know whether there are any large financial interests behind Mr. Ballew or not, but it seems to us that there is scarcely any improvement that could be made that would be of more benefit and value to the communities interested than an electric line across the north and south railroad lines of northern Missouri. Besides providing cheap and rapid transit for both freight and passengers, it would increase the value of farm lands and town property, and be a convenience which we do not now enjoy.

Eastern capital could be attracted no doubt, but we believe if this matter were properly presented to the people of Harrison and Mercer counties, that an abundance of home money can be found to build and equip the road. The business men and other citizens of Cainsville should be alert, and do all in their power to make this proposition an assured fact.—Cainsville News.


