**YOUTHS GREW BOLD.**  
**Three Young Men Denied Privilege of Keeping Company with Daughter Visit Home and Abuse Family.**  
Otto Henderson, of Lindley township, and William and Fred Williams, of Decatur county, Iowa, were arrested on last Friday by Constable George Peterson, of Saline, and later arraigned before Squire Vernon Campbell on the charge of disturbing the peace of William Harris and family on the night of May 4th. It seems that Mr. Harris is the father of two pretty daughters and that one or two of the young gentlemen mentioned above had endeavored to keep company with them, only to have their aspirations vigorously denied by a stern parent. Mr. Harris, who is the complainant, alleges that on the night above indicated, the young men filled with resentment--and liquor--visited his home and called him to the door, whereupon they proceeded to curse and abuse him in most villainous language. They were finally induced to quit the premises but in leaving one of them dropped his revolver, which is now in Mr. Harris' possession. Prosecuting attorney Kesterson informs us that the case will be tried before Squire Campbell on next Friday. He states that he does not know which one of the young men dropped the revolver and that the charge against them is a plain disturbance of the peace. We are inclined to the belief that the revolver will remain unclaimed for at least the next twelve months.--Princeton Telegraph.
