## The Man Who Meddled

They had even named the man they had robbed and perhaps murdered. The student had only to go to the police and state his case, and all the clues would be in their hands. He had about decided to do this when he went down to breakfast, but a little circumstance changed his mind. The landlord himself brought his breakfast and after a word or two about the weather carelessly observed: "I trust that the senior slept well last night?"
