

New Mexico Letter.

TRUCUMCARI, NEW MEXICO, March 15, 08. LEON REPORTER.—A few items about New Mexico: First I will tell about our little city, it has an inhabitation of about four thousand. We have three railroads and a round house, have the 10 1/2 Rock Island straight through our little city and the Dawson line running from Denver, Colorado, and Choctaw running from Texas. Our town is composed of two wholesale houses, two banks, five lumber yards and a dozen or more hotels and sleeping rooms. Can buy anything here that you can in Kansas City and just as cheap. Our city is located on the north side of the valley. The valley extends 25 miles south to the Cap Rock, where it jumps up a thousand feet upon the plains, extends east and west to the Pecos river. The soil is of two kinds, one is a sandy loam of a clay subsoil, the other is a tight land with a clay subsoil. The Cap Rock mountains are fringed with cedar timber which make plenty of posts and wood for the settlers, all or about all this land has been filed on. But there is a chance for a man with little means to yet get a hold. There is many a young man that has filed, that has not means enough to hold down his claim and his relinquishment can be bought cheap. There is other land that has been deserted, that can be got cheap with a straight filing. Our water is good, depth all the way from 20 to 250 feet. Can raise anything here that you plant, can raise corn, maize, Kaffir cane, broom corn, cotton, peas, beans, melons and anything you want to plant. We have from 26 to 28 inches of rainfall through the summer season. Never gets cold enough to freeze the ground more than one inch here through the winter. We are 3000 feet above sea level. Have more pretty sunshiny days here than any place in the world. Have never tried yet to raise small grain but think it will be as good here as in Oklahoma or Kansas. All kinds of fruit does well here except the peach. No Texas fever with the cattle, no cholera with the hogs, everything is healthy. Now if this escapes the waste basket I will come again. J. W.
