### A Dangerous Character.

During Friday and Saturday there was in Lamoni one Dick Bird, of near Ridgeway, who had attempted to poison a whole family by pouring the contents of two boxes of rat poison into the cistern where they obtained water for domestic use, and subsequently had lain in ambush by the roadside behind a barricade made of boards obtained from an empty dwelling house. He was armed with a repeating rifle and a revolver, waiting for this family returning from Decoration day exercises.

Some little boys chasing a rabbit discovered the man lying behind the barricade and who informed the authorities. A posse was raised to capture the man, and after a long chase he eluded their vigilance. After all but one man had left the field, and he not armed, by the glint of the setting sun shining on the man's gun barrel, he was discovered up in a tree. Before aid could be procured the shades of evening had set in and the fellow again escaped. His mania was writing letters to girls, and this led to his wild and foolish act.

Early on Monday morning L. L. Kopp, a constable from near Eagleville, called on Mayor R. M. Elvin, of Lamoni, to have the man arrested if found here. Soon after word was received of his capture near Andover about noon. The sheriff of Harrison county took the prisoner to Bethany.—Lamoni Chronicle.

### Sent to the Asylum.

Dick Bird, a well known character for whom the sheriff and constables have been searching for two or three weeks, was located in the north part of the county Monday and arrested by constable L. L. Kopp. For several months he has given evidence of a deranged mind and has been annoying persons, generally ladies, until the situation became serious. He has been writing letters to those whom he happened to fancy whether he had the honor of an introduction or not and these were generally sent by registered mail. Some time ago a well at the Ronich Hefner place was found to contain "rough on rats" and it was suspected that he was the author of this piece of mischief.

Lately he took refuge in an old log structure that had fallen down in E. H. Frisby's pasture near Bethany and it was feared that he meant to way lay some one passing along the road. Some boys, while hunting, chased a rabbit into his rendezvous and discovered him there. Parties were sent out to try to apprehend him and he was discovered up in a tree but before the officers could reach him he climbed down and out ran them and escaped into the dense brush. He was next heard of in the north part of the county where he attracted attention by his peculiar conduct. He carried a gun and slept out doors and carried a sack of eggs which he was supposed to be roasting when hungry. The people became afraid of him and he wrote a letter to a young lady whom he was not acquainted with. When he came into the post office at Andover Monday to inquire for his mail, Mr. Kopp followed and when he turned around found himself looking down the barrel of a gun. He was brought to Bethany on the noon train and Tuesday the county court was convened and heard the evidence in the case and

adjudged him of unsound mind. He was taken at once to the asylum at St. Joseph.

He got into trouble here one night last winter and was seriously cut by some other parties. After that he took a notion to study law in a lawyer's office here and was around town for several weeks.—Bethany Democrat.
