Wayne County Farmer Suicides.
It is our painful duty to chronicle the death of Walter Grissmore, of Benton township, who came to his death Wednesday evening from a self inflicted wound.
As we learn the facts Mr. Grissmore was at his father's farm near by a short time in the afternoon, going from there to the farm of his brother, who also resides near by where he borrowed a single barreled shot gun, alleging some purpose for his need of it. He then returned home, reaching there about five o'clock. After playing for some time with one of his children he went to the barn to do his chores. A short time afterwards a shot was heard and on investigation Mr. Grissmore was found lying in a stall in the stable shot in the breast, and he lived only a moment after.
The coroner's investigation developed that it was a case of suicide, but the part that is not clear is how he managed to discharge the gun, as the barrel was evidently too long for a person to reach the lock, and nothing was found that could have been used to discharge the weapon.
In the pocket book was found a note in which he expressed love for his family but gave no reason for the rash act. It is a sad and distressing affair and the sympathy of the community goes out to the afflicted family.—Corydon Democrat.
