TO PUBLISH PROCEEDINGS.

Last Legislature Made Law Compelling City Councils to Publish Proceedings in Papers.

By the terms of a new law, enacted by the last legislature, our city council, in common with others all over the state, will hereafter be obliged to publish in the city papers a condensed statement of all the business done at each meeting.

The title of the law is, "An act requiring city and towns to publish the acts or proceedings of the board of aldermen and city and town councils," and is as follows:

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

Section 1. That immediately following any regular or special meeting of the board of aldermen, or city or town council of an incorporated city or town, the city, or town clerk shall prepare and cause to be published in two or more newspapers of general circulation in said city or town, and if only one newspaper is so published, then in one newspaper, or if none be published, then by publishing in two or more public places, a condensed statement of the acts or proceedings of said board of aldermen, or city or town council of such meeting, together with a list of all claims allowed, the amounts of money to be paid and from what funds appropriated.

Section 2. That the compensation allowed each newspaper for such publication shall not exceed one-third of the legal fee provided by the statute for the publication of legal notices.

New Game Laws.

We have been asked what new game and fish laws were passed by the recent legislature, and in reply to an inquiry state fish and game warden Geo. A. Lincoln writes that the new law consists of the hunter's license law, resident \$1.00, non-resident \$10.00, which takes effect July 4, 1909. Prohibits the shipment of game fish for sale taken from public waters of this state; prohibits the sale at any time or any place of any game bird or animal in this state, or shipment of same either within or without the state; gives deputies concurrent power and same duties as sheriffs and constables. All these new laws except the hunter's license law, which takes effect July 4th, are now in effect.

Disappeared Years Ago.

After leaving Harrison county, Missouri, twenty years or more ago and supposed to be dead, the mother and son of Marion Rowland, now residing in Davis City, have just received word of the death of Mr. Rowland near Scotia, Washington.

Mr. Rowland leaves a claim of considerable value upon which there is at least \$1,500 worth of timber at the present time, with other property which will go to the mother and son. Mr. Rowland left this county many years ago and nothing was heard of him. Those who knew him in the days of his residence in Harrison county supposed that he had passed away many years ago and had almost forgotten him. A few days ago a letter was received by the postmaster at Eagleville, inquiring for the relatives of Rowland. A letter to the relatives informing them of his death and of the property belonging to the estate was enclosed. The postmaster advertised the matter in papers near his home and finally located the mother and son at Davis City, in Decatur county. The letter was forwarded to them. The letter was written by a Mrs. Moon, who was a neighbor of the dead man. In her letter she stated that Rowland had been ill for some time and died after a lingering illness.—Davis City Index.
