

### A Letter From J. W. Delk.

Cheyenne, Wyo., April 9, 1910.  
Editor of The Reporter, Leon, Ia.  
Dear Sir:—I see in a recent issue of your paper some of the gentle breezes from Colorado, and thought I would add a zephyr from Cheyenne. As your Colorado correspondent has never been to Cheyenne and looked over this country thoroughly I do not see how he could stretch his imagination in condemning this country to such a great extent.

I am not in the real estate business, neither am I locating homesteads, but I have looked this country over thoroughly and have seen what they produce here, and although I have never been exactly in his district in Colorado, I have talked with farmers who have farmed here for three years who had farmed there also, and they tell me this country is far ahead of Colorado. Our soil is not so sandy, and we have a better atmosphere, better water and a more productive soil than in the dry farming districts of Colorado.

To the man who, under the adverse conditions of the high prices for land, high taxes and heavy interest rates, finds the burden of farming in the east undesirable; to the man who desires that his children shall find an opportunity to establish themselves in the world; to the farmer who desires to secure fertile lands cheaply, preserving his capital for the development of his farm, southeastern Wyoming offers attractions unsurpassed. If a band touring the northern and southern boundaries of Laramie county was stretched across the continent to the Atlantic coast, it would cross central Nebraska, southern Iowa, northern Illinois, Indiana, Ohio and northern New Jersey. Our climate is much more equable than that of similar latitudes of the east. The air is always pure and dry with abundant sunshine. It is not severe in winter but generally mild. In the hottest summer weather it is cool in the shade, and the nights are always cool. The dry exhilarating air serves as a tonic that makes health and happiness here, in a way that is unknown under the duller skies of the east and south.

It is a fact worthy of mention that the invalid officers of the United States army are sent here to recuperate by order of the military surgeons and it was also due to our extremely healthy climate that induced the army officers to recommend the enlarging of Fort Russell, located here to one of the largest inland posts in the United States.

Excellent water with no trace of alkali can be obtained anywhere at a reasonable depth, and no country on earth can furnish more or better water for all purposes. The entire country is underlaid with a sheet of water that seems to have its origin from the snow-capped peaks surrounding us and to derive its supply from the melting of the snows, thus assuring its purity and abundance.

That Wyoming is not a state inhabited exclusively by cowboys and shipherders is shown by the following figures taken from the State Bureau of Statistics of 1908. She produced 34,000 bushels of corn, 1,775,000 bushels of wheat, 2,839,000 bushels of oats, 45,000,000 tons of sugar beets and had 227,000 acres of tame hay besides barley, rye, field peas, milo, maize, cane millet and many other forage crops grown to perfection. Wheat averaged 30 to 65 bushels per acre, oats 40 to 70 bushels per acre, barley 50 to 80 bushels per acre. Dry farm potatoes produced from 150 to 300 bushels per acre and commands a premium over irrigated potatoes. Alfalfa, dry farmed, will produce two good crops, cutting about two tons per acre; under irrigation it produces much more. The markets are unexcelled owing to the close proximity to the great mining and manufacturing centers of the west.

The live stock industry of this section has a valuation of nearly \$5,000,000, while Wyoming leads the world in the production of wool. Unimproved irrigated lands are sell-

ing at from \$30 to \$150 per acre; deeded dry farming lands at from \$8 to \$25 per acre. There still remains subject to entry under the enlarged homestead law, the Mndel Act, about 12,000,000 acres. We have the land and the opportunity that we need most is the people. But simply because this is a land of wonderful opportunities, it must not be inferred that this is a lazy man's paradise. It requires work to win success here as everywhere else, but to the man of intelligence and ambition there is a greater reward for his energies here than elsewhere.

Cheyenne is the capital city, and has about 20,000 intelligent, self-reliant, active and hospitable people. Almost every religious denomination is represented here and are amply provided with means to care for their work. Almost all the secret organizations are strongly represented and are in a flourishing and prosperous condition. The city expends about \$50,000 annually on their public schools which will give a fair idea of the manner in which all public work is provided with funds to carry it to completion.

The "Booster" spirit is strong here and that there is nothing too good for Cheyenne seems to be the motto of her enterprising, wide-awake businessmen.




