#### Iowa to Have Deer Hunt—A Unique Experience.

We have all heard of the big circle hunts for wolves, but Iowa is soon to have a hunt of this kind for deer. Final preparations have been made for the capture of the several herds of wild deer, numbering 300 to 400, which have for years overrun a section of southwestern Iowa unmolested, owing to the protection of the law. Under the direction of State Game Warden Lincoln and Deputy Game Warden Groneweg of Council Bluffs, one of the feeding grounds of the deer, a plot of ground containing about ten acres, is being enclosed by a high fence. One side of the enclosure will be left open. In the center will be placed feed and salt. For some time after the fence is completed the deer will be permitted to come and go unmolested. On the inside of the enclosure is being built a smaller enclosure in which it is

planned to finally drive the deer and capture them for shipment. The scene of this unusual work is on a farm in Pottawattamie county near Avoca. About the middle of December a deer hunt extraordinary will take place. On a day selected by the game warden the citizens will be invited to come and participate in the hunt. No guns will be allowed. The plan is to form what is commonly known in countries where wolves become troublesome is a circle hunt. The hunters will be distributed over a large territory, the prospect of some rare sport insuring the presence of men in sufficient numbers to form a monster circle. At a given signal the line will begin to narrow and the deer within the circle will be driven toward the big enclosure. The deer, owing to their years of unrestrained freedom from molestation, have become unusually tame as it is, and it is anticipated that they can be driven very

easily into the enclosure. One side of the fence will remain open. Several hundred will, however quickly put it in place once the drive is completed. The deer thus captured will be disposed of under the direction of the state officials. For two years the state has been trying to devise some means of ridding the farming communities where the deer roam, of their presence, the herds yearly committing great destruction to crops. Their numbers have grown from a small herd of thirty-five turned loose about twelve years ago by a man named Cuppy, who lived at Avoca and who decided to free what was left of the herd he had been raising for his own amusement and profit. It is estimated there are now fully 500 of the deer roaming southwestern Iowa. They have been known to destroy a young orchard of several acres in a single night.
