Pick up the contents of a large can of salmon; add salt, pepper and a tablespoonful of lemon juice; beat smooth and gradually fold in a small cupful of whipped cream; put into a buttered mold and steam three-quarters of an hour; turn out and surround with piles of potato balls covered with melted butter and chopped parsley.
