

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

The prize, a 36x63 Whittall Anglo Persian, goes to Miss Edith Hall, of Van Wert, with a guess of 15,000. Another guess of 15,000 was made but was entered at a later date. The lowest guess was 1,000; the bighest 1,050,000.

## **1 Pound 4 Ounces of Dirt** Were Removed

The prize, a 27x54 Anglo Persian, was awarded to Mrs. F. C. Mullinnix, with a guess of 1 3-8 pounds.

With but one exception, the guesses were higher than the actual result. The lowest guess was 3-4 of a pound; the highest 1200 pounds.

The reason for this overguessing is that the rug is so closely woaen that it does not collect dirt in the weave. All the dirt collected was on the surface; and on a piece of linoleum, laced under the rug, absolutely no dirt was found. This proves conclusively that the Whittall weave is dirt proof.

The rug came through this strenuous test with even the fringe unharmed. It has been sent to the Whittall Mills to be cleaned, and as soon as it is returned, it will be sold to the highest bidder. Someone will get this \$82.50 rug at his own price.


