LOW BRANCHES MUST BE CUT

Property Owners Should Remove
Overhanging Limbs or City Will
Do the Work and Make
Assessment.

ARE A GREAT NUISANCE

Untrimmed Trees Cause Grief to
Those Who Drive, and Give
Streets a Bad Ap-
pearance.

The department of public safety has decided that not only shall the streets of Keokuk be smooth, so that driving may be comfortable, but also that there shall be no overhanging projections to make life miserable for those who use the thoroughfares, announced Commissioner Hilpert this morning. Projecting limbs of trees must be cut, or trouble will be in store for the owners of the property, where the trees grow.

Under the city ordinance regulating the growth of trees, it is provided that there shall be no branches on trees along the streets, that have branches projecting lower than eight feet. The law has been on the statute books for several years, but its presence has been overlooked, and all over the city, limbs of trees have been permitted to grow in such a manner as to obstruct traffic.

City May Do Work.

If the limbs on these trees are not removed speedily, the force of men now engaged in cutting high grass and weeds around the city may be put to work removing the obstructing limbs of trees. The work will be charged up to the property owners, by special assessment. The law also provides penalties for its violation.

The nuisance of overhanging limbs is one of the greatest that exists on Keokuk's streets. In some sections of the city, especially in the northwestern part, great limbs hang down to within four or five feet of the street. Of course, when an automobile or buggy drives along, the top is caught by the overhanging branches and often considerable damage is done to the vehicle.

Ruins Appearance of Streets.
The appearance of the streets is spoiled by the rank growth of trees, and by carefully trimming them, to remove these low limbs, a more metropolitan air will be given to the thoroughfares.

An immense amount of work cutting weeds and high grass on vacant lots has been done by the gang of eight men working under the direction of the city commissioners. The weed nuisance has almost been obliterated. Hay fever, the disease which is caused by the presence in the air of pollen from the weeds, will probably be much less prevalent this year than formerly.


