### DR. RUDD TO PREACH SERMON

Fort Madison Rector Will Deliver Sermon at Ordination of Rev. Jones Tomorrow.

All preparations for the ordination service at St. John's tomorrow have been completed. At 11 o'clock, the Rev. Alfred Lee Jones will be advanced to the priesthood, the Rt. Rev. Harry S. Longley, D. D. bishop suffragan of Iowa and bishop of Des Moines, officiating. The sermon is to be preached by the Rev. Edmund H. Rudd, D. D., rector of St. Luke's church, Ft. Madison. Special music has been prepared by the vested choir of forty voices under the leadership of George W. Barnes, choir director. The ordination of a deacon to the priesthood is a most impressive service in the Episcopal church and as this ordination is the first ever held in St. John's, it has aroused much interest. 
