

The Rival Undertakers. [United Press Leased Wire Service.] IOWA MOINES, Iowa, Oct. 17.—The Iowa supreme court today reversed the decision of the lower court in the famous cases from Storm Lake in which an undertaker sent a man whose wife was critically ill, a card: "Bear in mind our undertaking department, satisfaction guaranteed." The sender signed a rival undertaker's name. The rival, H. L. Hughes, sued Samuel Brothers for damages for libel, but lost in the lower court.
