

Daylight Savings Plan

By congressional enactment at 2 o'clock tomorrow morning, every clock throughout the United States is to be advanced one hour and continue until the last Sunday in October. Many people think this is a rather foolish movement, but we are all creatures of habit and a great many laughable.

This agitation continued until in 1883 when W. F. Allen of the Railroad Time convention, secured the adoption of this plan by ninety per cent of the railroads. The same year the International Geodetic society in session at Rome adopted a time standard based upon twenty-four meridians, each of which was one hour apart.

The daylight saving movement started in England by a builder named Willet. His plan was to retain standard clock time except for the period between April and September, when the clocks should all be set one hour forward. His proposal at first met with laughter, but, however, continued to agitate it until he secured the introduction of a measure in parliament and for a number of times it was voted down, but at each session of parliament it always secured additional votes.
