## "BILL" BERRY PINCHED TWICE


Carthage Man Holds Record for Being Picked Up Twice Within Few Hours Last Night While in Keokuk.

They Will Ask the Candidates What They Propose to Do for the Race, and Will Get Pointers on Ballot Casting.

The object of the meeting was to make plans for the colored people in regard to the fall election. A committee composed of Mrs. C. D. Bland and Mrs. Selby Johnson was appointed to make a canvass of all of the colored voters in Keokuk, and especially of the colored women. A committee was also appointed to wait upon the candidates for office and to ascertain from them what their attitude was toward the colored people and what they are going to do if they are elected to office.
