MAKE HASTE TO BUY AUTO PLATES

License for 1921 is Due Now and Fees are Assessed for Failure to Get Them Until After January 1.

ONLY FEW APPLIED

There are Only 800 Registered to Date While There are 4,200 Autos in Lee County.

Keokuk motorists are warned not to wait until the last minute to secure their automobile licenses. A fine of one dollar is added to the license fee after the first of the year, and people who have failed even to apply for their new plates run the risk of contributing \$2.95 to the treasury of the city of Keokuk.

According to reports from the office of County Treasurer Skyles, there are so far only 800 automobile licenses already secured. As there are 4,200 owners of autos in Lee county, it is expected that there will be the usual last minute rush for plates.

It is figured out that an average of 260 licenses per day must be issued between now and the first of the year to keep up this record. The licenses have been coming in at the rate of sixty to seventy in both of the offices.

The 1921 license fee is based on the selling price of cars before June 1, 1920, and owners are not getting the benefit of the cut in automobile prices in their licenses, it is figured out.

Instructions from F. J. Murphy, superintendent of the motor vehicle department of the secretary of state's office, explains that license fees for 1921 are based upon selling price of the car on June 1, 1920. Hence the reduction in selling price after that date does not affect the price of the state license.

The 1920 rate books issued by the secretary of state contained a number of errors in selling prices and weights, due to manufacturers giving the state officials incorrect weights and list prices. These cars have been corrected in the 1921 rate book, but not to the extent of allowing for the reduction in selling prices announced after June 1, last.

Owners who purchased cars this fall at the reduced price will be compelled to pay a license fee based on the selling price of the car prior to June 1.

LETTER WILL AID MERCHANT

Revenue Department Sends Out Word With Reference to Filing of Annual Inventories Which Will Be Helpful.

William McCormick, division chief of the internal revenue service at Ottumwa, has requested that the following letter be made public, as it will help local merchants who are filing their annual inventories. The letter is from the department at Dubuque and is as follows:

You will, no doubt, be called upon by merchants who are taking annual inventories as to what basis they will use for filing for the period in 1920. I wish to refer you to article 1582, regulations 45, which reads:

"Inventories should be valued at (a) cost or (b) cost or market whichever is lower. Which ever basis is adopted must be applied to each item and not merely to the total of the inventory; that is, if for instance basis (b) is adopted, the value of each item in the inventory will be measured by market if that is lower than cost, or by cost if that is lower than market. A taxpayer may, regardless of his past practice, adopt the basis of cost or market, whichever is lower, for his 1918 inventory, provided a disclosure of the fact and that it represents a change is made in the return. Thereafter changes can be made only after permission is secured from the commissioner."

Please understand from the above that inventories based on cost or market in 1918 had to be accompanied by a disclosure of the fact, while in years after 1918, it is necessary that permission be given by the commissioner to change from either cost or market. Therefore, any taxpayer who wishes information in regard to the inventories on cost or market, you should advise them to immediately write the office at Dubuque, Iowa, asking for permission to change and same will be forwarded to the commissioner for approval.
