COUNTY NURSE IS CONSIDERED

Fort Madison Red Cross Chapter is Planning to Engage One to Take Care of Work in the Schools.

A county nurse in Lee county schools is to be discussed by the Red Cross chapter of Fort Madison. The Democrat says: "Definite action on the employment of a nurse to look after tuberculosis patients and further work of sanitation in the schools of the county, is expected to be taken at the annual meeting of the Fort Madison chapter of the American Red Cross. "The need of a county nurse is generally recognized, and the Fort Madison chapter has been working on the plan for some time. The employment of the nurse rests to a large extent on the success of the membership campaign of the Red Cross, now nearing a close. "The duties of the county nurse will be to seek out and extend whatever expert aid possible in the treatment of tuberculosis patients and also to further methods of sanitation in the homes of the county through the school children. "Other important matters will be taken up at the meeting, among them being the election of officers for the year and the reports of committees and department heads."

PRESIDENT OF IRISH REPUBLIC

De Valera May Be on Way Home, as His Whereabouts in United States Is Not Very Definite.

[United Press Leased Wire Service.] NEW YORK, Dec. 16.—Eamonn De Valera, "president of the Irish republic," intimated today that when he got ready to return to Ireland he would slip out of the United States without a passport, just as he came in. Commenting on reports that Premier Lloyd-George might let him return to participate in peace negotiations, De Valera said he did not ask Lloyd-George's consent before leaving Ireland and that he wouldn't ask his consent before going back. This comment by De Valera was given out at Irish headquarters, but De Valera himself failed to appear. It was explained he was ill. Attaches of the headquarters gave an air of mystery to his whereabouts. His suite at the Waldorf has been given up, and while the Sinn Fein office in Washington said he was en route to the Pacific coast, Irish offices in the west said he was in New York. This gave rise to a report that he had already started back to Ireland.
