

# AUDUBON COUNTY BOARD PROCEEDINGS

Audubon, Iowa, July 3rd., 1916  
Auditors Office:—

Board of Supervisors met at 8 o'clock A. M. as per adjournment of June 15th. members present, E. F. Johnson Chairman, B. J. Black, Soren Madsen.

Minutes of the last meeting read and approved.

On motion the following resolution was approved.

Whereas, on the 27th day of June, 1916 the Board of Supervisors of Audubon and Guthrie Counties in joint session decided to extend the mileage of the present county road systems of said Audubon and Guthrie Counties, Iowa, and

Whereas, it appearing that the highway now existing between sections 19 and 30 and 31 township 80 range 33 west of the 5th. P. M. Iowa and sections 24, 25 and 36 township 80 north range 34, west and highway between section 6 township 79 north range 33 west, and section 1 township 79 north range 34 west 5th. P. M. Iowa, would improve the present highway system, by connecting the county highways between the respective county seats, therefore, be it

Resolved: that the highway above described be added to the present county systems of said Audubon and Guthrie Counties, Iowa.

Whereas, at a joint session of the Boards of Supervisors of Guthrie and Audubon Counties, Iowa, a vote resulted as follows.

Resolved: by the Board of Supervisors of Audubon County, Iowa, in regular session assembled that in conformity with said joint resolution, adopted June 27th, 1916, that subject to the approval of the State Highway Commission, the following described highway is hereby added to and made a part of the County Road System, of Audubon County, Iowa, viz

Beginning at the N. E. corner section 24-80-54 and running thence south between sections 24 and 25-80-34, and sections 19 and 30-80-33, and terminating at the N. E. corner of section 36-80-34.


