Proceedings of the Board of Supervisors of Howard County, February Session.

Adjourned meeting of the January session, Tuesday, February 25, 1913. Board met pursuant to adjournment, Supervisors, Chas. H. Wallace, Chairman of the Board, and J. W. Conway, and E. A. Hoopman, County Auditor and Clerk of the Board were present. Meeting called to order by Chas. H. Wallace.

On motion, the report of the appraisers on Road No. 307 $\frac{1}{2}$ awarding damage to the amount of \$600.00 was accepted. Attorneys W. L. Barker for petitioner and John McCook for claimant appeared before the Board. There being no evidence presented to the Board, on motion, the Board granted the petition establishing Road No. 307 $\frac{1}{2}$ provided the damage of \$600.00 and costs are paid by petitioner on or before April 5, 1913.

On motion the Board adjourned at 5 o'clock p. m. until 8 o'clock a. m., Feb. 26, 1913.

SECOND DAY.

Board met pursuant to adjournment at 8 o'clock a. m., Wednesday, February 26, 1913, with Supervisors Chas. H. Wallace, J. W. Conway and E. A. Hoopman, County Auditor and Clerk of the Board present.

The bids for doing the County road work were opened and awarded. On motion, the bid of S. Dotzler to do the County road work in the east half of the County for \$19.00 per day for complete crew was accepted and contract made.

On motion, the bid of Elmer and Chas. Wilkes to do County road work in the west half of the County for \$18.00 per day for complete crew, was accepted and contract made. Balance of forenoon was occupied in examining claims. The afternoon was occupied in attending the Supervisors and Trustees Meeting and at 5 o'clock p. m., Board adjourned to 8 o'clock a. m., Thursday, February 27, 1913.

THIRD DAY.

Board met pursuant to adjournment at 8 o'clock a. m., Thursday, February 27, 1913, with Supervisors Chas. H. Wallace and J. W. Conway and E. A. Hoopman, County Auditor and Clerk of the Board present.

On motion, contract to do the pile bridge work for the county was awarded to Chambers and Dobson. The balance of the day was occupied in examining claims.

At 5 o'clock p. m., board adjourned until 7 o'clock a. m. Feb. 28, 1913.

FOURTH DAY.

Board met pursuant to adjournment at 7 o'clock a. m., with Chas. H. Wallace and J. W. Conway and E. A. Hoopman, County Auditor and clerk of the Board present.

On motion, the following petitions were disposed of as follows: Petition of Mrs. Ole Swenson for cancellation of the tax on \$1200.00 soldiers exemption for 1912, on n-1-3 of lots 1, 2, 3, and east $\frac{1}{2}$ of south 2-3 of block No. 4, plat of Cresco; granted.

Petition of Mrs. Persis Hall for cancellation of 1912 tax on lot No. 1, and lots 6, 7, 8, 10, 22 and 25 on vacated plat of Vernon Springs on section 33-99-11, granted.

Petition of Frank Fleck for cancellation of 1912 tax on \$1200 tax erroneously assessed, granted.

On motion, petition of Mrs. Hattie E. Miller for cancellation of 1912 tax, and refund of 1911 tax, soldier's widow exemption, on lot 13, block 2, incorporated town of Lime Springs, Iowa, granted.

Bids for the publishing of Howard County Financial report was opened and on motion, was awarded to The Mead Publishing Co., for \$140.00 for 1500 copies.


