

PROPOSED NEW CHURCH FOR ORLEANS LUTHERAN CONGREGATION.

We present herewith a cut of the proposed new church to be erected by the Norwegian Lutheran church of Orleans township, about six and a half miles east of Cresco, served by Rev. Lauritz Larsen of our city. The plans for the church are drawn by Architect A. F. Gauger of St. Paul, and call for a beautiful, artistic, churchly and substantial building. The plans have been adopted by the congregation and advertisements for contractor's bids

are already published. The extreme dimensions of the church are 40 by 60, and when it is completed it will be a great comfort and credit to the congregation as well as a marked improvement in the locality. The congregation expects to have its last service in the old church Easter Monday after which they will go right to work to remove the old edifice, which has served them so well these nearly forty years.

TEACHERS' MEETING.

Robert Reinow, chairman of the executive committee of the Northwestern Iowa Teachers' association, announces the 19th annual meeting of the association at Independence March 27-28-29.

"In many respects this is the best meeting of the year for teachers. Being smaller, the number attending, ranging from 1200 to 1500 gives an opportunity for close, definite work not had in the state meeting. The time is selected with the thought that boards of education desiring to have teachers attend either during vacation or school time may do so by making the time of the spring vacation accordingly. It is earnestly urged that boards of education and county superintendents make every effort to have their teachers present; it is hoped that school authorities will feel that it is some little effort and expense for teachers to attend and deal with them generously, and further that teachers will realize the professional im-

portance of the gathering and their attendance.

"The program will comprise the customary general sessions on Thursday evening, Friday forenoon and evening and Saturday forenoon. The sectional conferences will meet Thursday afternoon and the round tables Friday afternoon."

Adaline Elsing Trask was born at Elmira, N. Y., Oct. 15, 1849, and peacefully passed away at Cresco, Iowa, March 7, 1913.

Her father died when she was four years old. At the age of six she came with her mother to Clayton county, Iowa. She was left without either father or mother at ten years of age and for some years made her home with her uncle.

On Christmas day, 1865, she was united in marriage to John Gager and to this union there were born five children, four of whom are still living, Miss Nettie Strawn of Cresco, Lorenzo D. Tipton, Iowa, Mrs. Evelyn Jones of Mason City and Virginia of Cresco. Two brother, Lorenzo H. Trask of Blunt, S. D. and Lyman W. Trask of Ft. Worth, Tex., who with the bereaved husband and fourteen grandchildren are left to mourn her death.

She was converted at an early age and united with the Methodist Episcopal church of which she was a constant member until about 1877 when she with her family joined the Baptist church of Cresco of which she was a member until her death.

Most of her life was spent near Cresco and a large number of friends mourn the departure of a noble friend and neighbor.

The end came very peacefully and her faith in Christ was expressed by her last words.
