

BOARD PROCEEDINGS.

Adjourned meeting of the April, 1913, session of the Board of Supervisors of Howard County, Iowa.

First Day.

The board met pursuant to adjournment at 1 o'clock p. m., Wednesday, May 7, 1913 in the office of the county auditor with supervisors Chas. H. Wallace, chairman of the board, J. F. Pecinovsky and J. W. Conway and E. A. Hoopman, county auditor and clerk of board, present.

Meeting called to order by Chas. H. Wallace, chairman. Under the provisions of the road law enacted by the Thirty-fifth General Assembly which became effective April 9 1913, the board took up the matter of establishing the county road system.

On motion W. L. Richards was employed as County Engineer at a compensation of \$5.00 per day and five cents per mile mileage each way.

The board met pursuant to adjournment, at 1 o'clock p. m., with all members present.

The afternoon was occupied in examining claims against Howard county on file with the county auditor.

Weather Crop Bulletin.

For the week ending May 11, 1913 Des Moines, Iowa. The past week was cold, and over the southern and eastern counties unusually wet. Showers were general on Thursday and Friday, and in many localities on Monday. The average temperature was about four degrees below the normal, and light frost occurred in many sections on two or three mornings, but no material damage was done to fruit, which is still in good condition. Where the rainfall was not too heavy rapid progress was made in preparing ground for corn, and considerable corn was planted especially in the northwestern counties. The rains were beneficial to small grains and potatoes, and in the eastern counties, where the soil had been dry, it put the ground in good condition for plowing.
