After dinner, short speeches, most of them reminiscent of pioneer days, were made by Mesd. A. E. Barker, Ed Rivers, J. C. Livingston, M. M. Moon, Miss Hattie Howe, and Messrs. S. A. Converse, J. B. Mitchell, G. V. Puntney, John F. Murtha, N. S. Durgin and D. A. Lyons. A paper of old time life by Mrs. W. A. Smith was read by Mrs. Moon. The principal address was by R. A. Schutz, of Le Roy. He is connected with the Farmers' Institute work of Minnesota and gave a good, common sense talk, punctuated with some brand new stories.

Robt. Thomson acted as chairman and you may be sure that each speaker got an appropriate introduction. Rev. Burgess, one of Lime Spring's pioneers, offered prayer, and a choir of old settlers and old settlers' children sang several old time songs.

A large number were present who came to this vicinity in the '50's, including G. V. Puntney, the oldest settler, who came to Plymouth Rock in 1851. Howard County's first school

teacher, Mrs. J. C. Kellow, was also present. Howard County's first couple married, Mr. and Mrs. Ed Gillette, were unable to attend on account of the wedding of a granddaughter.


