Second Day.

The board of supervisors met pursuant to adjournment in the office of the county auditor in the court house at Cresco, Iowa, July 7th, 1913, with Supervisors Chas. Wallace, chairman of the board, J. F. Pecinovsky and J. W. Conway and E. A. Hoopman, county auditor and clerk of the board, present.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Chas. H. Wallace. Mr. A. Marston, chairman of the State Highway Commission and State Highway Engineer Root being present. On motion the board adjourned to 8 o'clock a. m. Tuesday, July 8, 1913, to view bridges and roads.

The board met pursuant to adjournment at 8 o'clock a. m. July 8th, 1913, with all members present.


