SIMMONS GIVES OUT ESTIMATES

Senator Outlines Probable Results of New Tariff.

INCOME AND CORPORATION TAX

Former for 1914 is Expected to Total \$66,000,000 and Latter \$38,000,000. House May Act on Bill at Once and the Senate is Regarded as Likely to Pass the Measure Thursday.

Washington, Sept. 30.—Senator Simmons, chairman of the senate finance committee, gave out the first complete estimates of federal revenues and expenditures under the new tariff bill as made up by the experts from the treasury. The total estimates are:

For the year ending July 1, 1914: Receipts, \$1,029,000,000; expenditures, \$1,013,000,000; surplus, \$16,000,000.

For the year ending July 1, 1915: Receipts, \$1,026,000,000; expenditures, \$1,008,000,000; surplus, \$18,000,000.

The estimated receipts under the customs tariff, the income tax and the corporation tax, embraced in the new tariff, are given as follows:

For 1914: Customs revenues, \$270,000,000; income tax (ten months), \$66,000,000; corporation tax, \$38,000,000.

For 1915: Customs revenues, \$249,000,000; income tax, \$83,000,000; corporation tax, \$39,000,000.

"The customs revenues will be larger for the current fiscal year 1914," said Senator Simmons, "because the rates of the Payne-Aldrich law have been for the first quarter and will continue in force on wool and woolen goods until Jan. 1 and on sugar until March 1."

"When the next fiscal year begins, July 1, 1914, all the rates of the new law will be in operation and the tariff duties collected will be smaller."

"The income tax, which is collected for the calendar year, can be collected for only ten months of the present year, as the law specifies that collection shall not go back of March 1, 1913. The estimated decrease in the total expenditures of the government for 1915—\$5,000,000—is based on the fact that smaller expenditures are expected for the army and navy estimates."

The balance of the total estimates, as given in the treasury estimates, is made up of postal receipts, internal revenue receipts, the profits from public land sales and other sources of federal income.

The house took up the bill today and it is believed that it will be passed before adjournment. It is expected to reach the senate Wednesday and to pass that body by Thursday.

STOP WATCH IN BRAIN TEST Used to Note Time Schmidt Takes to Answer Questions.

New York, Sept. 30.—A stop watch as a means of testing the working rapidity of the human brain was employed by an alienist in the case of Hans Schmidt, the German priest, who has confessed to cutting the body of Anna Aumuller into pieces and throwing them into the Hudson river.

Schmidt was being examined at the instance of District Attorney Whitman by Dr. George H. Kirby, who, as he asked the priest questions, used the watch to note the time it took Schmidt to gather his ideas and put them into words.

All this was with a view to determine whether Schmidt is insane.

HALTS CHICAGO PARK PLAN

Lake Front Project is Disapproved by Secretary Garrison.

Washington, Sept. 30.—Chicago's lake front park project was disapproved by Secretary Garrison of the war department on the ground that it would halt commercial development.

Acting upon an exhaustive report from Brigadier General Bixby the secretary declined to grant any of the requests of the Chicago park commissioners for unrestricted permission to occupy water front property.

The commissioners, if they desire, will be given a hearing.

HANNA OUT FOR SUFFRAGE

North Dakota Governor to Aid W. C. T. U. Campaign.

Lisbon, N. D., Sept. 30.—Plans to conduct an active campaign for equal suffrage were made at the closing meeting of the North Dakota W. C. T. U. Backed by the pledge of Governor Hanna that he will support the women at the polls next year they are confident of success.

Mrs. E. Preston Anderson was again elected president.

Express Company Loss \$5,000.

Tuscaloosa, Ala., Sept. 30.—Losses of the express company, whose safe was dynamited when three bandits held up and robbed the Alabama Great Southern train last week, were \$5,000 and several pieces of jewelry. It was announced.



SENATOR LODGE VERY ILL

Massachusetts Solon Undergoes Serious Operation.

Nahant, Mass., Sept. 30.—United States Senator Henry Cabot Lodge, senior member of the Massachusetts delegation in congress, who was operated upon Friday for a gastric ulcer, according to his physicians, is "not entirely out of danger."

News of the senator's illness leaked out by accident. Then it was learned for the twenty-four hours following the operation his life had been despaired of. The operation, his physicians said, was successful, but the patient, weakened by his labors at the extra session of congress, did not have the vitality to rally promptly from the shock.

His recovery, according to Dr. F. B. Harrington, one of his physicians, is largely a matter of vitality, in which his sixty-four years and the fact that he was worn out previous to the operation must be taken into consideration.

MULATTO BOYS KILL AND MAIM Two Drug Crazed Youths Slay Eight Persons.

Harrison, Miss., Sept. 29.—Two drug crazed mulatto boys, brothers, began a reign of murder here that ended only after three white men, four negro men and a negro woman had been killed, twenty persons wounded and the two boys lynched.

A serious clash between the races was prevented by the arrival by special train of national guardsmen from Natchez.

The trouble continued intermittently until Walter Jones, the eldest of the two boys who started the firing, was lynched just after the soldiers arrived. His brother, Will Jones, had been shot and killed by citizens earlier.

MAY NOT BE SAME MAN

Photograph of Johannes Schmidt Does Not Resemble Mainz Priest.

Berlin, Sept. 26.—The police of Frankfurt-on-the-Main have received from New York a photograph of Father Johannes Schmidt, the self-confessed murderer of Anna Aumuller, but according to the Tageblatt they found no comparison between the American photograph and one in their possession of the former Mainz priest. They were so unlike that it is doubtful whether the two men are identical.

The difference in the characteristic features of the mouths and around the eyes are so great that if the photographs represent the same person he must have greatly changed since he left Germany.

GEORGIA CONGRESSMAN DIES

Representative Roddenbery Succumbs to Nervous Breakdown.

Thomasville, Ga., Sept. 26.—Congressman Seaborn A. Roddenbery, who had been ill at his home here since Sunday, is dead.

A nervous breakdown last week compelled him to leave Washington. Congressman Roddenbery was elected to represent the Second Georgia district in the Sixty-first congress in February, 1910, filling an unexpired term, and was re-elected to the sixty-second and Sixty-third congresses.

OREGON RATE LAW INVALID

Bill Passed on Initiative of People is Unconstitutional.

Portland, Ore., Sept. 30.—In a decision in the United States district court by Federal Judge Wolverton the Medford initiative freight rate bill, passed under initiative by the people of Oregon Nov. 5, 1912, was declared unconstitutional and void.

The bill fixed an arbitrary classification of railroad freight rates in the relation that carload rates bore to less than carload rates.

FILES BRIEF IN TEXAS RATE CASE

Commerce Commission Alleges Violation of Federal Law.

CONFLICT IS SHARPLY DRAWN

National Body Contends for Power to Prevent Discrimination Against Interstate Commerce by State Railroad Commissions.

Washington, Sept. 30.—The interstate commerce commission, in a brief to the supreme court in the so called Shreveport case, strongly contends for power to prevent discriminations against interstate commerce by state railroad commissions. The conflict between federal and state jurisdictions in the regulation of railroads is sharply drawn in these cases, which grew out of orders by the Texas state railroad commission alleged to be discriminatory in favor of Houston and Dallas, Tex., and against Shreveport, La.

The interstate commerce commission ordered the Houston, East and West Texas Railroad company and the Texas and Pacific Railroad company to remove the discrimination resulting from the exaction of rates on traffic from Shreveport to Texas points that were relatively greater than the rates maintained on like traffic to the same destination from Dallas and Houston.

The rates on traffic from Houston and Dallas to other Texas points were made by the Texas railroad commission and the railroads contest the power of the interstate commerce commission to consider these intrastate rates in connection with interstate commerce.

P. J. Farrell, the commission's solicitor, holds, however, that the purpose of the Texas state rates was to discriminate against interstate commerce and that congress has clothed the commission with power to prevent this.
