REGARDS ENTIRE ELECTION VOID

Official American View of Situation in Mexico.

MAY LIFT EMBARGO ON ARMS

Also Will Refuse to Recognize Any of the Acts of the Incoming Mexican Congress.

Washington, Nov. 11.—Development in the Mexican situation tended to emphasize a purpose on the part of the Washington government to refuse to recognize any of the acts of the new Mexican congress and brought to light the fact that serious consideration is being given by President Wilson to the question of permitting exportations of arms to all factions in the Southern republic.

Secretary Bryan had a long conference with Senor Algara, charge d'affaires of the Mexican embassy, during which it is understood he said the United States considered the election of congressmen equally as invalid as the voting for president and vice president.

The secretary summoned the ministers from five Central American countries and outlined to them in general what had been done by the United States in its diplomatic parleys with the Huerta government.

Later he announced that he also had been in communication with the diplomatic representatives of the foreign powers and had informed them of the steps taken by the United States thus far.

Home Governments Informed. It was reported some of these diplomats transmitted long dispatches to their home governments describing the situation as approaching closer to a complete break in relations between the United States and Mexico than at any time since the Mexican problem became troublesome.

The state department made public Huerta's statement to the diplomatic corps in Mexico City at midnight last Saturday, the burden of which was that the presidential election would be declared null and void, but the newly elected members of congress would soon be installed; the national legislature would soon resume the legislative powers which General Huerta had seen fit to assume.

In view of the fact that the note recited in detail Huerta's defense of his assumption of legislative authority and his arrest of the deputies, and gave also his program for the future, it was taken by many diplomats as an obvious reply to the American suggestion that he eliminate himself.

ADVISES HUERTA TO RESIGN

General Porfirio Diaz Appeals to Dictator's Patriotism.

Paris, Nov. 11.—General Porfirio Diaz has advised General Victoriano Huerta to retire from the presidency of Mexico. Two sides of General Diaz, each acting separately and by authorization of the former president, sent telegrams to Huerta last week to this effect.

In outlining his attitude General Diaz said that in the present situation of the Mexican people in relation to the United States it is not a question of whether Huerta is the best man for the presidency, nor is it a question of whether the revolutionists are right or wrong; it is a question of patriotism.

He counseled General Huerta to renounce any feelings of personal prestige or power and thus save Mexico from a calamity.

HIS WOUNDS NOT SERIOUS

General Felix Diaz Recovering From Attack at Havana.

Havana, Nov. 8.—General Felix Diaz has recovered his composure at the hospital to which he was taken for surgical treatment after he had been wounded in the neck in the attack on him by Mexicans.

All that Diaz could tell about the incident was that he and his companions were listening to the music played by a band in the Malecon promenade, when the electric lights were suddenly extinguished and he was attacked. He asserted that he was entirely unable to account for what afterward happened. His wounds are not serious.

CONVICTION IS SET ASIDE

William Haywood Freed of Disorderly Charge.

Trenton, N. J., Nov. 11.—The state supreme court here set aside the conviction of William Haywood, who, with two others connected with the Industrial Workers of the World, was convicted on a charge of being disorderly persons in connection with the recent strike of the Paterson silk workers.

Wilson Nominates Malone.

Washington, Nov. 11.—President Wilson nominated as collector of customs Dudley Field Malone of New York for the district of New York, the post formerly held by John Percory Mitchell, mayor elect of New York.


