

BOARD PROCEEDINGS

The Board of Supervisors of Howard County, Iowa, met in regular session in the office of Cresco, Iowa, at 1 o'clock p. m., Monday, November 10th, 1913, with supervisors Chas. H. Wallace, J. F. Pecunovsky and J. W. Conway and E. A. Hoopman, County Auditor and Clerk of the Board, present.

The meeting was called to order by Chas. H. Wallace, Chairman of Board.

On motion the Board authorized J. E. Wells, overseer of poor of Cresco, to issue orders to the Alliance store for groceries for Maud Powell, to the amount of two dollars per week to May 1st, 1914.

On motion the petition of Hering and Mosher for a refund of the 1911 tax and cancellation of the 1912 tax on \$1552.00 erroneously assessed against lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7 Subdivision of Lot 5 Irregular Survey on the N. W. 1-4 Sec. 30-99-14 was granted.

The balance of the day was occupied in examining claims against Howard County on file with the County Auditor.

On motion at 5 o'clock p. m. the Board adjourned to 8 o'clock a. m., Tuesday, November 11th, 1913.

SECOND DAY.

The Board met pursuant to adjournment at 8 o'clock a. m., Tuesday, November 11th, with all members present.

On motion contract was made with the Northern Iowa Telephone Co. for phone for the County Engineer's office for \$15.00 for one year to be paid monthly.

On motion the Auditor was instructed to issue a warrant on the poor fund to John Smalley for \$36.40 the same being money left by him with the County Treasurer.

On motion the petition of Mary 1912 tax Cresco corporation same being a tax on team erroneously assessed was granted.

On motion the bond of Joe Svoboda assessor appointed for New Oregon to fill vacancy was approved.

On motion contract was made with C. P. Pecunovsky to build a 4x3 culvert in New Oregon Twp. for \$300.00.
