

### DEPLORES TALK IN OPEN SENATE

Shively of Indiana Replies to Fall of New Mexico.

### WARM DEBATE OVER MEXICO

Senator Fall Narrates Many Incidents of Outrages to Americans and Asserts Present Policy is Inadequate. Senator Shively Says Administration is Aiming to Work Out Peaceful Solution.

Washington, March 10.—Excitement over the outspoken demand for intervention in Mexico, made in the senate by Senator Fall, Republican, of New Mexico, did not diminish until after Senator Shively of Indiana had spoken for the administration. The galleries were crowded to overflowing for hours. Senator Shively expressed regret that the subject had been discussed in open session. He asserted that no adequate suggestion had been offered to compose the difficulty.

Senator Fall, in a lengthy narration of incidents of outrages to Americans in Mexico, held the interest of the senate and gallery for more than three hours. Assailing the policy of the administration as inadequate in the situation and declaring that President Wilson knew nothing about real conditions and had been mistaken in every act of his administration toward Mexico, the New Mexico senator pleaded for intervention to avoid inevitable war.

Emphasizing the danger of war with a great foreign power unless something is done speedily Senator Fall referred to comments in the German press over the killing of the British subject, Benton, by order of General Villa's courtmartial, and declared:

Points to Danger of War. "When the German official press says that should a German citizen be murdered in Mexico, Germany would not acquiesce like Great Britain, then I say to you senators there is imminent danger of a conflict between the United States and this country with which we should always be at peace."

"I believe the American people can be left to handle any critical condition, provided they are informed on the subject. I am not one who believes, when the press is full of reports of outrages and details of Mexican horrors, that it can be 'incompatible with the public interest' to send to this senate details of outrages upon American citizens. I am not one who believes that the Constitution should be pushed aside and let one man assume the executive and legislative powers of the government."

Senator Shively, replying as acting chairman of the foreign relations committee, declared that Senator Fall's policy would mean actual armed intervention and that intervention meant war. He deplored that the situation had been thus discussed in the open senate, declaring that it would have a harmful influence upon the attitude and temper of the people of Mexico.

Striving to Find Solution. "If composition of the difficulty is available by watching and waiting the people of the United States could have a just grievance against their government if it should start now the march, the march, the camp and the battlefield," he said. "The government is exerting its energies to work out a solution without precipitating war and all that war means."

"After all we have listened to I put it to you if a practical solution has been suggested. Because the senator has seen fit to leave the situation in this way it does not furnish reason why we should resort to the remedy suggested. The very description he has given of Mexico repels the idea that it is an easy way out of the difficulty."

"Those who are responsible for our foreign policy are doing all that can be done. They are not swift to rush to arms; they are men who think and weigh the facts and measure consequences of acts before they commit us to them. I repel the notion expressed that the department of state and the president are neglecting any duty that involves the peace and welfare of the country."

### OBJECT TO RATE ADVANCE

Eight States File Protest With Commerce Commission. Washington, March 10.—On behalf of eight states, Iowa, Kansas, Nebraska, Arkansas, Missouri, Oklahoma, North and South Dakota, and the National Live Stock association, Clifford Thorne, chairman of the railroad commission of Iowa, protested to the interstate commerce commission against the proposed advance of railroad freight rates in Eastern territory.

In arguing against the proposed increase Mr. Thorne explained that his people "heartily favor the elimination of all free services and favored shipments."

Mr. Thorne contended that until a physical valuation of railroad properties is made the reasonableness of returns received by the roads cannot be determined.

### OFFICERS FIGHT WITH VAGRANTS

Deputies Drive Unemployed Out of Sacramento.

### FIREMEN AID WITH WATER

Five Hundred Armed Officers Round Up "General" Kelley's Men and Force the Shivering and Drenched "Army" to March Out of California Capital.

Sacramento, Cal., March 10.—Starving and bruised, 1,000 members of the unemployed armies which have held Sacramento in terror for forty-eight hours were driven from the city by 500 armed deputy sheriffs.

Shivering with cold from the drenching given them by the fire department and swearing vengeance on Sacramento the armies are now encamped in Yolo county, between this city and Broderick. Several hundred armed deputies are preventing a retreat or advance.

The unemployed were driven off the Southern Pacific right of way by officials armed with pick handles and clubs. They refused to go but several streams of water played upon them by firemen started a mad retreat.

In fleeing through Second street the unemployed attacked street cars, hurling rocks and sticks through the windows, and forcing passengers to take refuge on the car floors.

At every cross street the armies, which had become a leaderless mob, threw up barricades and battled with the police and deputy sheriffs until dislodged by the firemen. Stores and saloons were wrecked.

With nineteen of the armies' officers, including "General" Kelley, in jail, charged with vagrancy, many of its members in the hospitals and jails with broken heads and the remnant encamped on the plain overlooking the city, the march to Washington has been abandoned. It was declared.

### LIABILITIES OF \$2,026,257

La Crosse Railway Contractor Has Assets of \$1,200.

La Crosse, Wis., March 10.—With liabilities of \$2,026,257 and assets of only \$1,200, of which \$300 is exempt, Arthur E. Appleyard, a railroad contractor, has been summoned to appear before Referee in Bankruptcy C. L. Baldwin of La Crosse, at Ashland, Wednesday, and relate his business experiences the past few years.

The sensational aspect of the case was revealed by the serving of an injunctive order, issued by Judge A. L. Sanborn of the United States court, prohibiting the bankrupt petitioner or any other person from tampering with or destroying the books or papers pertaining to the financial operations of Appleyard.

The purpose of the hearing is to adduce full and accurate information respecting the financial operations of Appleyard and to ascertain if all assets have been listed in the bankrupt petition.

### JURY ACCUSES DETECTIVE

Holds Recent Slaying in St. Paul Saloon Unjustifiable.

St. Paul, March 10.—Detective John Delaney killed Joe Sweeney in the Hardy saloon Feb. 27 and his act was not justified, according to the verdict of the coroner's jury. The jury was out less than an hour.

In holding Delaney not justified in his act the jury said: "Delaney was a party to forming a plot with Detective J. C. Thomas, J. J. Murphy and one Higgins for the purpose of arresting Sweeney and James Rully in the act of robbing the saloon, thereby inviting homicide."

A short time after the verdict was returned Delaney was suspended from the police force by Chief Michael Gebhardt. Thomas was not suspended.

### DYNAMITE PLOT AT MINE

Dying of Fuse Saves Lives of Shift Boss and Forty Workers.

Virginia, Minn., March 10.—Richard Ledecock, shift boss at the Minorea mine, and forty miners narrowly escaped death when unidentified persons, thought to be discharged miners, placed three sticks of dynamite under the dry house. The fuses "died" before reaching the explosive.

Ledecock, a member of the Salvation Army, is said to be strict with his men, and has discharged some within the past month.

### PUT UNEMPLOYED ON FARMS

Governor of New York Plans to Distribute Idle of Gotham.

Albany, N. Y., March 10.—The distribution of the unemployed of New York city by the carload among farms in this state is the object of a plan worked out by Governor Glynn and Calvin J. Huson, state commissioner of agriculture. The first carload is expected to be taken out next week. The plan includes women and children as well as men, the women to do housework.
