is Now in Drydock.



RAIDER IS NOW IN DRYDOCK

United States Naval Board Will Examine Kronprinz Wilhelm.
Newport News, Va., April 20.—The German auxiliary cruiser Kronprinz Wilhelm was moved into drydock at the shipyards here for the naval board's survey on which will be based the time to be extended for making the cruiser seaworthy. United States naval officers will make the examination immediately.
Captain Thierfelder requested additional coal and provisions for port purposes which probably will be granted.

THAW'S APPEAL FOR LIBERTY IS DENIED

New York, April 17.—Harry Kendall Thaw was ordered back to the state hospital for the criminal insane at Matteawan by the appellate division of the New York supreme court. In an opinion concurred in by all the justices the court affirmed the denial by Supreme Court Justice Page of a motion to return Thaw to the jurisdiction of New Hampshire, whence he was extradited to stand trial for conspiring to escape from Matteawan asylum.
The court ruled that the original order committing him to the institution was still valid. Plans are being formulated to take the case to the state court of appeals.
A decision adverse to Thaw came as a surprise to his counsel.
Thaw himself refused to comment on the action of the court.

LIBEL CASE JURY COMPLETE

William Barnes Wants \$50,000 Damages From Colonel Roosevelt.
Syracuse, N. Y., April 20.—The jury which will try William Barnes' \$50,000 suit for alleged libel against Theodore Roosevelt was completed in the supreme court. It is composed of seven Republicans, three Progressives and two Democrats.
Twenty-two talesmen were examined before both sides announced they were satisfied with the twelve men in the box.
Immediately after the jury had been completed counsel for Colonel Roosevelt made a motion to dismiss the complaint against their client upon the ground that such allegations as he made in the statement upon which the suit is based were privileged and that in naming Mr. Barnes and Charles F. Murphy of Tammany Hall as the controllers of "rotten government" in the state of New York he did not mean anything personal or to imply that either of the two men named had in any way profited by the alleged "rottenness."
The motion was denied by Justice William S. Andrews, presiding.

ANARCHISTS ARE SENTENCED

Frank Abarno and Carmine Carbone Given Terms in Sing Sing.
New York, April 20.—Frank Abarno and Carmine Carbone, the anarchists who made and set a bomb in St. Patrick's cathedral March 2 when hundreds were worshipping within the edifice, were sentenced to serve not less than six years nor more than twelve in Sing Sing prison.
Abarno and Carbone were found guilty by a jury last week. The detection and conviction was due to the detective work of a young Italian policeman, Amedeo Polignani.

CANAL IS RUNNING BEHIND

Revenues Are 10 Per Cent Short of Cost of Operation.
Panama, April 16.—Since the opening of the Panama canal the expenditures have been in excess of the revenues approximately 10 per cent, due to the cost of maintenance and operation of the waterway. In the period from July 1 to March 1 the canal authorities have spent \$2,595,000 and the canal has earned \$2,234,000.

BRITISH FORCES AGAIN ADVANCE

Capture and Retain Important German Position.

REPULSE COUNTER ATTACKS

London War Office Gives Brief Details of Another Engagement Along Western Front.

London, April 20.—Activity prevails again along the western battle front. Engagements are reported along the Meuse and the Lorraine border and in the vicinity of Ypres, where, according to an official statement of the war office, an important battle has been won by the British army.

As the time nears for the expected general offensive of the allies it is believed in some circles here that the movement already may be under way. Others military observers maintain that the battles of the last few days are too isolated to admit of such an inference.

"A successful action commencing on the evening of the 17th culminated in the capture and complete occupation of an important point known as Hill 60, which lies about two miles south of Zillebke, to the east of Ypres," says the war office statement. "This hill dominates the country to the north and northwest."

"In the Vosges our attack carried out on both banks of the Fecht river resulted in a further advance by forcing the enemy to vacate precipitately Esbrucke, above Metzeral, where they abandoned a large amount of material."

BRITISH FORCE REPULSED

Losses Heavily in Attack on German Position in France.

Berlin, April 20.—The British attempt to destroy through mining operations the strong German positions southeast of Ypres has failed, the war office announced.

The British were repulsed with heavy losses. The official statement says:

"The English after some blasting Sunday night rushed the German position at the heights south of Ypres. They were repulsed in a counter attack. The fighting here continues. "In the Champagne the French have blasted a trench in the position taken on April 16 by the Germans between the Meuse and the Moselle. "Artillery duels are in progress in the Vosges. Southwest of Stossweier the Germans carried the outposts, but fell back before a superior force of the enemy."

SENATE PASSES BOXING BILL

Minor Changes Send Measure Back to Minnesota House.

St. Paul, April 20.—The senate passed the bill legalizing ten-round boxing matches in St. Paul, Minneapolis and Duluth under the supervision of a state commission by a vote of 35 to 32. All members were recorded and the bill obtained one in excess of the constitutional majority.

Several minor amendments were adopted which will necessitate confirmation by the house before the measure goes to Governor Hammond. The governor has not indicated his attitude.

Picked as War Observer.

San Diego, Cal., April 20.—Captain Arthur Pollon of the First cavalry, which is stationed at the Panama-California exposition here, was notified that he had been selected as a military observer for the United States army in the European war.

SAYS FRANCE IS GRATEFUL

Ambassador Jusserand Talks to Daughters of Revolution.

Washington, April 20.—The need of self-possession, calmness and a judicial temperament on the part of the United States in the present world crisis was urged by President Wilson in a speech before the opening session of the twenty-fourth continental congress of the Daughters of the American Revolution.

The president said self-possession is the supreme test of a nation's mettle and urged the congress to rally to the cause of righteousness, as ministers by those who hold their minds quiet and judge upon principle.

After the president's speech Ambassador Jusserand of France told the congress that the United States had behaved in the European crisis in such a way as to command the gratitude and thankfulness of the world.

"We in France," he said, "have learned to know what the American gold that is in it. I am glad that I may affirm the thanks of France for the generosity of America."
