## American Legion Meeting

A called meeting was held Wednesday evening, Oct. 23, 1919, at Court House, at the command of L. A. Glass, Post Adjutant, with fifty-two members present. A motion was carried that G. E. Lyons and Chas. Tillson be appointed a committee to present to the School Board of Cresco an application in writing for the use of the High School Gymnasium twice a month, the times thereof to be determined by the School Board, for business and social meetings of the post.

It was moved and carried that Allan Shackleton, Jr., be elected to honorary membership to this Post with full privileges and rights therein except the right of vote.

It was moved and carried that a permanent committee be appointed by the Commander of this Post to consist of one member from Cresco, one from Elma, one from Lime Springs, one from Chester and one from Protivin, said committee to investigate and report to the Post at each meeting all matters wherein relatives of deceased soldiers, sailors and Marines may need the assistance of the American Legion, especially all questions regarding insurance, compensation and bonus.

Lowry, Feuling, Deane, W. Powers and Clink were appointed a Committee to arrange for a dance to be held on Armistice Day, November 11th under the auspices of the American Legion.

It was moved and carried that the Post Adjutant correspond with the Decorah and New Hampton Posts to arrange a foot-ball game between either of the last two named posts and this Post on Thanksgiving day.

Every soldier, sailor and marine is urged to join this Post before Nov. 11, giving to those who do so join before that time an opportunity to become charter members.

Moved, seconded and carried that the following resolutions be adopted:

Whereas, the people of this county and especially those hereafter specifically named, have, in a great measure, made our service in the army, navy and marines more enjoyable through their untiring efforts, generous contributions and personal interest in each of us, and

Whereas we, upon our return home, have been greeted and welcomed in a manner far surpassing the welcome extended to the returned war veterans in other localities, and

Whereas the many banquets, and celebrations in our honor have contributed in a great measure to facilitate and adapt us to our pre-war occupations and realizing that these honors have necessarily incurred much labor and great expense, Be it therefore

Resolved that we, the Howard County Post, American Legion, for and in behalf of all the returned soldiers, sailors and marines of this county, extend our most sincere thanks to all those who so generously contributed and assisted in the late war, and especially the Red Cross Chapter, The Commercial Club, The Welcome Home Committee, the various Church and Lodge organizations which have had charge of the banquets, the members of the Band, and to that organization, The Boys and Girls Scouts, and its able leader, J. H. Howe, of which and of whom we are indeed proud, and be it further

Resolved, That we publicly proclaim and commend the honest, efficient and absolutely impartial efforts of Dr. George Kessel, Sheriff D. J. Ferris and County Auditor E. A. Hoopman, members of the Howard County Exemption Board, and be it further

Resolved, that a copy of these Resolutions be printed once in the Howard County Times and once in the Cresco Plain Dealer and that a copy be pre-

served in the minutes of this organization.
