

champion sire, Heather Blackbird. Her second dam was sired by Blackbird
Bruce, a son of the Imported Prince of Seaford, and out of Blackbird McHenry
25th, another highly bred Blackcap cow of the same blood lines as Blackcap
McHenry 150th. Her second dam was a granddaughter of Blackcap McHenry


