Proceedings of Board of Supervisors of Howard County, Iowa.

Cresco, Iowa, April 13, 1920.

The Board of Supervisors of Howard county, Iowa, met pursuant to adjournment.

The meeting was called to order by John F. Hale with the following members present: John F. Hale, chairman, presiding with Supervisors J. W. Wells and J. H. Watson, all members being present.

*The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

On motion duly seconded at 5 o'clock p. m., the board adjourned to 8 o'clock a. m., April 14, 1920.

Second Day.

The board met pursuant to adjournment with all members present.

Pursuant to notice to bidders, at three o'clock p. m., the bids filed for labor and material on Drainage District No. 4, were opened and considered.

On motion duly seconded the bid of W. H. O'Brien was accepted and the Chairman authorized to sign contract at the following schedule:

Laying 6" tile 22 cents per foot, 8" tile 33 cents per foot, 26" tile \$1.25 per foot, back filling and grading old ditch 85 cents per cu. yd., cleaning old ditch below tile at \$2.00 per cu. yd.

On motion duly seconded the bid of The Cement Product Company to furnish the tile on Drainage District No. 4, was accepted and the Chairman was authorized to sign the contract at the following schedule:

Six inch tile at \$97.00 per M. feet, 8" tile \$150.00 per M. feet, and the 26" tile at \$348.00 per M. feet.

On motion duly seconded the board hired Brown as County Engineer to January 1st, 1921, at the rate of \$2400.00 per year and mileage.

On motion duly seconded at 5 o'clock p. m. the Board adjourned to 8 o'clock a. m. April 15, 1920.

Third Day.

The board met pursuant to adjournment with all members present.

Petition for Quit-Claim Deed.

To the Honorable Board of Supervisors of Howard County, Iowa:

I, E. R. THOMPSON, being duly sworn, say that Jno. A. Senneff is the owner in fee simple of the Northwest quarter (NW $\frac{1}{4}$) of the North east quarter (NE $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section Twenty-two (22) Township One Hundred West of the 5th P. M. That said premises were originally granted to Howard County, Iowa, by the State of Iowa, and that Howard County executed a quit-claim deed therefor prior to the time that said Patent was issued by the State of Iowa to Howard County, causing a defect in the title.

Your petitioner therefore asks that Quit-Claim deed be issued by Howard County, Iowa, to Jno. A. Senneff, to correct said defect.

M. is technically defective, and

Whereas, E. R. Thompson, acting for Jno. A. Senneff has filed a petition showing that Jno. A. Senneff is the present owner in fee simple of said premises, and

Whereas, Howard County, Iowa, makes no claim to said lands, therefore

Be it resolved, by the Board of supervisors of Howard County, Iowa, that the petition be granted, and

Be it Further Resolved, that the Chairman of this Board of Supervisors, Iowa, be authorized and are hereby empowered to execute a Quit-Claim deed to the said Jno. A. Senneff, conveying whatever interest Howard County may have in said premises to Jno. A. Senneff.

On motion duly seconded the following resolution was adopted:

Be it resolved by the Board of Supervisors of Howard County, Iowa, that the offer made by S. S. Culver and D. E. Henry and H. Edmonson to Howard county for the use of the gravel for \$350.00 in the 1.3 acres and the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 25-99-12 and lying south of the highway and east of the Turkey river and giving the county two years in which to remove the gravel be accepted, and

Be it Further Resolved, that the Chairman be and he is hereby authorized and empowered to sign the contract covering sand and gravel.

Be it Further Resolved, that the Auditor be and he is hereby authorized to issue a warrant on the Road Fund for \$350.00 in payment therefor.

On motion duly seconded at 5 o'clock p. m. the Board adjourned to 8 o'clock A. M. April 16, 1920.

On motion duly seconded the Trustees of Oak Dale Township were authorized to transfer \$100.00 from the Drag Fund to the General Fund.

On motion duly seconded the petition of H. W. Plummer for a refund of \$47.53 of the 1917 taxes and \$28.67 of the 1919, was granted. It being shown that he was entitled to soldier's exemption during these years, and the Auditor was authorized to issue refund warrants for same.




