BILL VETOED BY WILSON

Warns Congress Not to Overstep Rights As Legislators.

President's Veto of Appropriation Bill Carries Warning Against Infringement of Executive Powers.

Washington—President Wilson's veto of the legislative appropriation bill, as containing an infringement on executive authority, was sustained in the House against the effort of the Republican majority to override it.

Washington—President Wilson has sharply warned congress against measures invading the "province of the executive" branch of the government.

The message was transmitted with the president's veto of the executive, legislative, judicial appropriation bill, which contains a provision giving the congressional joint committee on printing supervision over government publications.

This measure carries the annual appropriation for the legislative, executive and judicial branches of the government and its re-passage by congress will be necessary. The total carried by the bill is \$104,000,000.

Power Usurpation Held.

The president took occasion in his message to notify congress that in his opinion it had no authority to "direct" the government printing office to perform its duties in a certain prescribed manner, as he declared had been attempted.

The section of the bill at which the veto was aimed provides that "no journal, magazine, periodical or other similar government publication" shall be issued except under regulations prescribed by the congressional joint committee on printing, and a proviso is added including in the category "mimeographing, multigraphing and other processes used for the duplication of typewritten and printed matter, other than official correspondence and office records."

MORTON DIES ON BIRTHDAY

Former Vice President Passes On Ninety-Sixth Anniversary.

Poughkeepsie, N. Y.—Levi P. Morton, former vice president of the United States and former governor of New York state, died at his home, Eilerslie, Rhinebeck-on-the-Hudson, on the ninety-sixth anniversary of his birth.

Mr. Morton was taken ill with a slight cold three or four days ago, but his condition did not become serious until a few hours before his death, when bronchial pneumonia developed. He lapsed into unconsciousness soon after. The end came peacefully.


