NEWSPAPER OF THE FUTURE

Tickers to Replace Presses Under Visualized Plan Which Seems to Be Quite Possible.

The newspaper office of the future—one without presses, typesetting machines, casting boxes or other costly and complicated machines used today in newspaper production—such is the office visualized by Oscar Roesen, vice president of R. Hoe & Son, press builders. In a letter to the Brooklyn Eagle recently, Mr. Roesen gives his idea of the possibility of the newspaper office of tomorrow.

"No press room," he writes, "but a large room filled with telegraph instruments and operators, each instrument connected with thousands of wires forming a cable running underground to the houses of all subscribers, a bulletin board in the home of every subscriber with a stock ticker printing arrangement connected by a wire with the main instrument in the publication office.

"When any news was ready and the copy was given to the telegraph operator it would be flashed over the wires, possibly one instrument printing through twenty thousand wires to twenty thousand subscribers, on the order of the telephone system, all the news as fast as it comes in.

"Before the subscriber goes to bed he puts in a fresh sheet of paper and while he sleeps the news is printed on the sheet and read at his breakfast."

Let Old House Burn; Fear Chilling Ghosts.

Sayville Depot, L. I.—The oldest landmark in Sayville, the unoccupied historic Gordon homestead, has been burned to the ground. It belonged jointly to the estate of the late banker, James T. Wood, who was associated with the notorious defaulting banker, Robin, when Wood placed the property in the name of a strange woman, whose whereabouts are unknown. This ghostly dwelling was removed in answer to many prayers of an incendiary nature. Local firemen were at the scene, but withheld the water, fearing to chill the ghosts dancing in the flames.

LARRY SEMON

Larry Semon, whose recent triumphs have impelled reviewers to style him "The New Comedy King," has risen to that coveted place by long training. Each stage in his career acted as a stepping stone to his great achievement. Perhaps he was born under a lucky planet. Anyway, he was fortunate enough to be the son of an actor and received an early training in magic, juggling and acrobatics. He mastered some of these arts before he had finished the third reader. After leaving school he traveled with his father and became more efficient in the art of entertaining.

Then followed the period in the newspaper business as cartoonist. This developed his creative ability and prepared him to write his own comedies. It also taught him to forsake the well beaten path and search in the byways for new material. A cartoonist must be original.

Thus, Larry Semon is perhaps the best qualified for the title of comedy king. All of his past experiences can be utilized upon the screen. He can resort to thrilling acrobatics where the average comedian is forced to use slapsticks. He is also adept in training animals and has a cat, monkey and six white mice that play difficult roles in his comedies.

During the three years previous to 1922, Albert E. Smith, president of Vitagraph, has agreed to outlay \$3,000,000 on Larry Semon in the production of 36 new comedies. "The Grocery Clerk," which is something different from the usual run of laugh makers, was the first film to be produced under the new contract. "Between the Acts," "Dew Drop Inn" and "The Head Walter" are some of Larry Semon's comedies that stand out prominent as being in a class by themselves.

HAS NEW WORLD MAP FOR FLYERS

Globe-Girdling Aviators to Use "Butterfly" Chart Instead of Mercator's

DEvised BY CALIFORNIA MAN

Aviator Using Mercator Projection Would Go 1,000 Miles Out of His Way in Trip From Panama to Yokohama, Says Inventor of Map.

San Francisco, Cal.—Flyers in the proposed 1920 world-girdling air derby will not travel by Mercator's projection, but by a new "butterfly" map, devised by J. S. Cahill of Oakland, Cal., which has just been adopted by Maj. Charles J. Glidden, executive secretary of the aerial derby commission, now on his way to the far East, and who gave the map his approval before leaving here.

Mr. Cahill, who is the originator of San Francisco's \$12,000,000 "civic center" plan, said that an aviator using the Mercator projection as a guide, would go 1,000 miles out of his way in a trip from Panama to Yokohama. "If the north pole were on an island a mile wide," he said, "it would appear on Mercator's projection to be 25,000 miles wide, or nearly the total circumference of the earth at the equator."

Advances "Rational Geography." The inventor of the new map, who worked on his drawings fifteen years, said that "an impartial and rational world geography is essential to world peace." He said that Mercator's projection, which was originally devised by the Belgian cartographer as a guide for navigators, distorted and exaggerated the earth as it receded from the equator. This, for instance, made it appear as if South America were much smaller than North America, when as a matter of

fact, he said, they were about the same area.

The Cahill map is as though an actual sphere had been cut and flattened, its appearance somewhat resembling the out-spread wings of a butterfly.

A nation looking unduly expanded on the map may easily, Mr. Cahill says, develop a sort of geographical "big headedness," inducing an over-bearing diplomacy. A nation whose territory is so unduly exaggerated on the maps in common use may well come to exaggerate its resources, its economic strength and even its virtues, and so create an atmosphere everything but conducive to mutual good will and consequent world peace.

"Butterfly" Map Simple.

All problems of intercommunication by sea, land or air are baffling and misleading on Mercator's chart, says Mr. Cahill, but simple and obvious on the "butterfly" map, a further aid to mutual knowledge and understanding. "Internationalism, now a sporadic and occasional thing, but destined in the future to be the keynote of all human endeavor, plays an important part in the science of statistics and meteorology," said Mr. Cahill.

"Graphical statistics are self-contradictory and ludicrous on Mercator's chart, and as for indicating the progress of high and low pressure rings in weather charts, the ever changing scale on Mercator's was simply bewildering to the forecaster who had to use them."

The new map, by showing all lands in their true proportion and form, he declares, would help materially in solving peacefully problems dealing with the world as a whole.


