Nothing the Matter With Kentucky.

Kentucky has 9,500 manufacturing enterprises with a capital of \$154,166,845, showing an increase in number during the past year of 1,615 with an increase in capital of \$27,446,508. Kentucky has 234,867 farms, valued at \$471,045,556, an increase during the past decade of 55,403, with an added valuation of \$42,875,892.

Kentucky received for spending money last year, not taking into account money received in salaries, wages, interest on moneys loaned, or dividends on stocks and sales of real estate, the sum of \$288,502,092, while the farmers of Kentucky received from sales of two crops alone—corn and tobacco—the princely sum of \$50,000,000 in round numbers.

Kentucky stands in relation to the other States of the South fourth in population, third in manufacturing, third in percentage of farms improved, third in homes owned by her people, third in school population, second in schools and third in value of farm property, while she is tenth in area of territory. There is nothing the matter with Kentucky. She is fully in line with the other States of the South, and these have been shown to be abreast of all the rest of the country.

Mining of Meerschaum.

(Philadelphia Bulletin.) "Meerschaum is mined like coal," said a pipe dealer. "It is a soft, soaplike stone, and in Asia Minor its mining is an important industry."

"The crude meerschaum is called hamtash. It is yellowish white in color, and a red clay coat or skin envelops it. The blocks cost from \$25 to \$200 a cartload. They are soft enough to cut with a knife."

"These blocks in summer are dried by exposure to the sun. In winter a heated room is necessary. "Finally the meerschaum blocks are sorted into twelve grades, wrapped in cotton and packed in cases with the greatest care."

"The bulk of all this meerschaum goes to Vienna. There the best pipemakers in the world live."
