HEAT KILLS 1,200 HORSES

Torrid Wave in New York Fatal to Animals Reaching the Value of \$300,000

New York, July 14.—More than 1,200 horses died from the heat in New York City in the last eleven days. One packing concern suffered a loss of \$70,000 in horse flesh and another corporation met with a loss of \$40,000. Estimating that horses are worth about \$250 each, the total loss in horse flesh in the city is set at \$300,000 by the newspaper statisticians and the loss throughout the country at more than \$1,000,000.


M'Namara Trial Oct. 10


