**WILL MEET AUGUST 5**

**Peace Will be Practically Decided at First Meeting of Envoys.**

**JAPAN WILL THEN OFFER TERMS**

**Friendly Governments Know General Character of Mikado's Demands. The Indemnity May Amount to \$1,000,000,000.**

Washington, July 27.—Whether there is to be peace or the Far East or a continuance of the war will be practically decided at the first business meeting of the Washington conference, which will convene at the navy yard, Portsmouth, N. H., about August 5. Baron Komura will on that occasion communicate to M. Witte the essentials of Japan's peace terms for further negotiations. This is declared, will not be done in a spirit of defiance. Indeed, there are many evidences in the possession of the neutral governments that Japan is coming to the Washington conference not imbued with a determination to humiliate Russia, but only to exact terms which will insure a lasting peace in the Far East and which will in a measure compensate Japan for the financial losses in the present conflict.

Throughout the preliminary negotiations, however, Japan has made it clear at Washington that she wished to avoid unnecessarily tedious negotiations. Although guarding with great care the official statement of her terms, Japan has not kept from several friendly governments the general character of these terms.

Official Washington has been enabled to form within certain limits a general idea of their character. It is known that Japan will demand an indemnity that will approximately cover the cost of the war to date. This was communicated to Russia early in the preliminary negotiations. The amount is still a secret, but it is based upon the most careful estimates of the cost of the war, and will be accompanied by a more or less detailed statement showing the method by which the final figures were computed. It will not fall far short of \$1,000,000,000, according to advices reaching here from well informed sources. Besides the indemnity, it is believed, Japan's other essentials are the continuance of the negotiations with the cessation to Japan of Sakhalin, of the Liao Tung peninsula and of the railway as far as Harbin; the recognition of Japan's predominant influence in Korea, and the return of Manchuria to China.

If the Russian plenipotentiaries are prepared to accept these essentials, the officials here are confident that the basis will be laid for negotiations sure to lead to the signing of the treaty of Washington, bringing peace in the Far East.

As for the subjects remaining to be discussed, a tedious one, it is believed, and one on which Russia will be disposed to negotiate with the greatest reluctance, is the program for the restoration of Manchuria to Chinese control. It is believed the policy to be suggested by Japan in this matter will not be unlike that followed by the Washington government with reference to Cuba, American troops being withdrawn from the island as soon as a stable government was in control of the situation.

Europe believes Japan will demand the neutralization of Vladivostok. The Washington government does not share in this belief. Indeed, in official circles here the statement is made without hesitation that such a demand would not be "moderate" or "reasonable," and it is known that Russia will not permit the subject of Vladivostok to come before the conference. Rather than submit to Japan's dictation on this point, Russia has let it be known that she would certainly continue the war.

**Fighting On Tumen River.**  
London, July 27.—The correspondent of the Daily Telegraph at Tokio sends a report received from Osaka, Japan, to the effect that a Japanese army of many thousand men is attacking the Russian position on the Tumen river.

**Japs Land On Siberian Coast.**  
St. Petersburg, July 27.—Dispatches from Manchuria report the landing of a Japanese battalion and the seizure of a lighthouse on the Siberian coast near Dokastriya, a post formerly called Alexandrovsk, 100 miles north of Vladivostok, after a preliminary shelling by torpedo boat destroyers.

**GERMAN PRINCE FOR THRONE**  
Kaiser Said to Have Found a Ruler For Norway.

London, July 27.—The correspondent of the Daily Mail at Stockholm says: "The object of Emperor William's interview with Emperor Nicholas was to obtain the consent of the latter for a prince of the house of Hohenzollern to succeed the throne of Norway. It is probable that the Russian emperor will consent, provided Russia be permitted to slightly rectify her frontier on the Atlantic."

The Daily Mail, commenting on the dispatch, suggests that the "rectified frontier means that Russia wants to acquire the strip of Norwegian territory which parts Finland from the Arctic ocean, thus gaining a seaport."
