**MR. GEO. E. COLE DEAD**

Was Sick Only One Week—Survived His Wife Only Seven Months.

Leaves Three Children, a Number of Relatives and Many Friends.

Mr. Geo. E. Cole, a well known citizen, died at his home on Washington avenue, on Saturday night, after an extreme illness of one week, aged 45 years. He is survived by three children, Mr. E. Dorsey Cole, Jr., of Alexandria; Miss Annie Taylor Cole and Horace Cole, of this city, and a large number of relatives.

Mr. Cole was a member of the Baptist church and was active in the Sunday school, being a member of Mr. Willoughby's Bible class of men and his predecessors dating back for many years. He was an affectionate father, a kind and obliging friend, and by his pleasing manner and accommodating and genial disposition won a host of warm friends, who sympathize with the sorrowing family and the deeply afflicted children, whose mother preceded their father to the grave some seven months ago.
