

CONDENSED NEWS.

Secretary Lincoln has returned to Washington. The Mexican National Railroad is completed to Morelia. The Bank of England reduced the rate of discount to 3 1/2 per cent.

The North Dakota convention is in session at Fargo to form a constitution. Emperor William has subscribed 20,000 marks toward restoring the Cathedral at Treves.

It is stated that the Czar, before returning to Warsaw, will meet the Emperor William at Tilsit. The strike at the Manchester Iron Works, Pittsburg, has ended by the reinstatement of the Superintendent.

Governor Butler has nominated Edwin G. Walker, a colored lawyer, as justice of the Charleston District Court. Two cars were burned and a brakeman's leg broken in a wreck on the New York & New England road at Andover.

The new Inman steamer, the City of Chicago, made a trial trip on the Clyde, accomplishing a speed of fifteen knots an hour. Eight cars were demolished in a freight wreck on the Lehigh & Susquehanna road, near Siegfried's Bridge, Pa., Wednesday morning.

The nineteenth biennial meeting of the American Pomological Society is in session at St. Paul, Minn., with forty members present. The Long Island Railroad Company has agreed to pay \$1,500 to the widow of John Hart, killed in a collision on that road on the 2d inst.

The new Haytian war vessel, to be named Desalline, when transferred to the Haytian authorities, made a successful trial trip at Philadelphia. The convocation of the colored clergy of the Protestant Episcopal Church begun in New York. Bishop Sharkey, of Newark, preached the sermon.

The Polish citizens of Chicago on Wednesday celebrated the 20th anniversary of the expulsion of the Turks from Poland by Sobieski by the victory of Vienna. The great council of the United States of Improved Order of Red Men, at Atlanta City, granted new charters to tribes in Texas, Kansas, North Carolina, and Iowa.

Admiral Sir Richard Collinson, K. C. B., F. R. G. S., is dead. He commanded the Enterprise expedition which left Plymouth in 1850 in search of Sir John Franklin. In the convocation of the Chapter General of the Knights of St. John and Malta, at Philadelphia, the warrant fee for organizing subordinate bodies was increased from \$30 to \$100.

One freight train ran into another on the Norfolk & Western Road, derailling ten cars, and badly damaging the locomotive. The wreck delayed the west bound passenger train. Nick Rodermann, a cattle dealer of Milwaukee, was arrested for the mysterious murder of Peter Kohebeck last Saturday, and confessed that he shot the latter in a quarrel over some trival matter.

In the coroner's inquest on the Riverdale explosion, at New York, there was a quarrel between the coroner and the steamboat inspector as to the custody of the pieces of the exploded boiler, claimed by both. Dutton Cook has just died, aged fifty-one. During his life he was engaged in literary, dramatic and art criticisms upon Punch, Cornhill Magazine, Pall Mall Gazette and the World. He also wrote several works of fiction.
