

## A TERRIBLE DEED.

Another Rose Ambler Case in Western Indiana.

**An Eighteen Year Old Girl Brutally Outraged and Murdered—Found in a Lonely Country House With Throat Cut From Ear to Ear—Supposed to Be the Work of Two Tramps—Other Crimes and Casualties.**

LAFAYETTE, Ind., Sept. 25.—The eighteen-year-old daughter of C. Atkinson, one and a half miles south of Oxford, was found murdered at 4 o'clock Tuesday afternoon at her home. The family were absent leaving her alone. Her throat was cut, from ear to ear in two horrible manner, and there were cuts and bruises on her head and body. She had been outraged and murdered, and it is supposed to have been done by two tramps who started in the direction of Lafayette. Officers here are on the lookout for them.

**CRUSHED HIS SKULL WITH A CLUB.**  
ROCKY MOUNTAIN, N. C., Sept. 25.—Richard Watson and Tim Edwards, both colored, were playing cards at Eason's Cross Roads, near here, when they got into a dispute, but not an angry one. Henderson Parker, another negro, being intoxicated, came up. Hearing the dispute, and thinking that Watson and Edwards were about to fight, he picked up a bludgeon and struck Watson over the head, breaking his skull and causing instant death. Parker fled and has not been captured, but the officers are on his track near Weldon.

**A DUEL IN PROSPECT.**  
RICHMOND, Va., Sept. 25.—The little town of Fincastle, the capital of Botetourt county, is in a flutter of excitement over an anticipated duel between Thomas J. Wilson, a prominent politician, and Deputy Sheriff S. B. Crush. The Sheriff, Crush's brother, has absconded, leaving large debts behind, and Wilson reported the facts to the press. For this Crush demanded a retraction, which Crush refused, and was then asked to resort to the field of honor. This has not yet been done, nor has any settlement been made. The officers of the law are in pursuit of Wilson, who is said to have gone to Staunton, Virginia. They are well known and trouble is anticipated.

**FOREIGN AFFAIRS.**  
Preparing for O'Donnell's Trial—Rumors of War.

**EGYPT.**  
ALEXANDRIA, Sept. 25.—The cholera in Egypt has not entirely abated. A few victims are reported daily, but nowhere is the disease on the increase.

**GERMANY.**  
BERLIN, Sept. 25.—It is rumored here that Prince Bismarck has arranged for an interview with King Alfonso, of Spain, and King Milan, of Serbia. It is stated that the object of the conference is the establishment of closer relations between Germany, Spain and Serbia.

**ENGLAND.**  
LONDON, Sept. 25.—Sir William Vernon Harcourt, Secretary of State for Home Affairs, has refused to allow Mr. Grey, O'Donnell's counsel, access to papers in the Home Department bearing upon the case of the slayer of James Caray.

The Secretary says that if O'Donnell is, as he claims, an American citizen, the arrangements for his defense should be conducted by the American legation.  
Mr. A. M. Sullivan, M. P., has, however, been retained by the friends of O'Donnell to act as chief counsel in the coming trial.

**FRANCE.**  
PARIS, Sept. 25.—The Congress of Free Thinkers began its sitting here in the Salle Molere. There were present many eminent skeptics from all parts of Europe.

**BERLIN, Sept. 25.**—The North German Gazette in an editorial justifies its publication of the confiscated letters of Deputy Antoine on the ground that the effect has been to arouse Frenchmen, who are law abiding, to the fact that there exists within the borders of France a society which is inimical to the peace of that country.

**TURKEY.**  
CONSTANTINOPLE, Sept. 25.—The Sultan has sent Reschid Pasha, his private Secretary, to Berlin on a secret mission. The Secretary is the bearer of an autograph letter from the Sultan to the Emperor of Germany.

The occasion of the mission is the fear of the Sultan that the coquetting of France and Russia has incensed Bismarck, and his desire in the event of future complications involving Turkey, that Germany may be counted among the powers friendly to the Porte.
