AFTER THIRTEEN YEARS.

The Remarkable Case That Closed In Philadelphia Wednesday.

PHILADELPHIA, Dec. 27. — Henry L. Moners was put on trial here Wednesday charged with being principal in the Kensington bank robbery, which occurred on the night of the 3d of February, 1871, nearly thirteen years ago, and which at the time created the greatest sensation ever known in that part of the city called Kensington. Maurice D. Murphy, the seventy-nine year old witness, who was at the time of the robbery one of the watchmen in the bank, was the only witness. His testimony showed that Moners was the man who did the principal work. At the time he was a policeman and the bank premises were on his beat. John Redgraves was his companion in the robbery. After the robbery Moners and Redgraves fied and were not captured. In 1875 Moners was convicted in the Montgomery County Court for robberies committed in Norristown. He was sent to the Eastern Penitentiary for ten years. In August last he was released from the Penitentiary and was at once sent to Moyamensing to await trial for bank robbery. The jury quickly rendered a verdict of guilty. Sentence was postponed.

PITTEBURG, Dec. 27.—At 6:30 Wednesday evening the tow boat Reindeer, having three heavily loaded coal barges in tow, was swept down the Monongahela River. Owing to the heavy current it was impossible to make a landing, the lines parting in every instance. Upon reaching Lock No. 1, a short distance above the city, the boat swung around, striking the wall of the swang around, striking the wall of the look, and was entirely wrecked. Her boilers exploded with a terrible report and she filled and sunk. One of the Largest Eastern Cotton Concerns Goes Up.

Providence, R. I., Dec. 27.—Amos D. Smith & Co., cotton goods manufacturers of this city, have failed, with liabilities estimated at \$1,500,000. The company assigned Wednesday. The firm comprises three branches, operating five mills, known as the Groten Manufacturing Company, the Providence Steam Mill Company and the Franklin Manufacturing Company. They had two mills here, two in Johnstown, and one at Woonsocket. They operated nearly 90,000 spindles and employed 10,000 hands. The assets are as yet unknown. Banks in Providence will probably lose heavily, some holding \$100,000 worth of paper. The lowest bank creditor is down for \$25,000. The concurn has been in a bad condition since 1873. Poor and old machinery and misunderstandings on the part of some members of the firm, as to the requirements of a manufactory of estion goods, contributed largely to the failure.




