



TO PREVENT TUBERCULOSIS.

Disinfectants to Be Used in Sprinkling Streets of New York.
New York, May 9.—Tests are being made of various chlorides and other chemicals in connection with a project now under discussion by the health department to check the spread of tuberculosis here. It is planned, should the tests prove successful, to use disinfectants in the water with which the streets are sprinkled. It is

believed that tuberculosis as well as many other diseases are spread chiefly in the dust of the streets.

Burglary Insurance Unprofitable.
Chicago, May 9.—The activity of burglars has made burglary insurance in Chicago unprofitable. A new rate schedule will be adopted. Representatives of the companies acknowledge that in the last ten years the Chicago agencies handling burglary insurance have sustained a loss of \$30,000.

Signed a \$40,000,000 Warrant.
Washington, May 9.—Secretary Shaw signed a treasury warrant for \$40,000,000, which was delivered Monday to J. P. Morgan & Co., of New York, as disbursing agents of this government on account of the Panama canal purchase.

To Establish a Jewish University.
New York, May 9.—Plans for the establishment of a great Jewish university in this country were discussed at a meeting held here Sunday night under the auspices of the New York branch of the Jewish theological seminary.

Death of Henry R. Davis.
Springfield, Ill., May 9.—Henry R. Davis, one of Sangamon county's wealthiest citizens, died Sunday night at his home in Pawnee, aged 76 years. He built the Pawnee railroad, of which he was president and general manager.

Will Compete in the Musical Contests.
Mexico City, May 9.—The artillery band (the Zapadores), the band selected to represent Mexico at the musical contests at the St. Louis exposition, will leave here for that city June 1. It is composed of 63 select musicians.

Counterfeiters Caught.
Progreso, Yucatan, May 9.—A house in this city has been raided by the police, who captured two Americans by the name of Ford and Williams, who were caught manufacturing counterfeit money. Counterfeiting material was found.

The Hungarian Band Arrives.
New York, May 9.—On board the steamer Umbria, from Liverpool and Queenstown, which arrived here Sunday, were Nikolaus Schilzanyi and his Hungarian band of 42 pieces, bound to the St. Louis exposition.

Shot Himself Through the Heart.
Pittsburg, Pa., May 9.—John W. Hutchison, chief engineer at the Heron Hill reservoir, shot himself through the heart while temporarily deranged.
