

The California Limited.

The management of the Santa Fe Route respectfully announces the resumption of the California Limited as a semi-weekly train for the season of 1896-97.

Beginning November 1, 1896, and on successive Wednesdays and Saturdays thereafter, this train will leave Chicago at 6 o'clock in the evening, passing Kansas City at 10:10 the following morning. At this point connection will be made with principal trains from the north, east and south, particularly with train leaving St. Louis at 9:15 Wednesday and Saturday evenings via the Wabash line, which will carry a through California sleeper attached to the California Limited west of Kansas City. Connection will also be made at La Junta with train from Denver. Los Angeles will be reached at 6:05 and San Diego at 10:40 in the evening of the third day out from Chicago.

Connecting train for San Francisco via Mojave.

East-bound, on November 9th and successive Mondays and Thursdays thereafter, it will leave San Diego at 2:45 in the afternoon and Los Angeles at 5 o'clock in the evening, reaching Kansas City at 5:30 the evening of the third day out, and Chicago at 9:45 the morning of the fourth day out. Through sleeper from Los Angeles to St. Louis will be transferred at Kansas City to connecting Wabash train and will reach St. Louis at 7 o'clock in the morning of the fourth day out. Connection will be made at Chicago and St. Louis with fast trains from and to the east.

The California Limited will carry standard Pullman double drawing-room sleepers of newest pattern and dining car between Chicago and Los Angeles. West of Kansas City a through buffet smoking car will be added, also the through sleeper from and to St. Louis via the Wabash above referred to. Connecting parlor car between Los Angeles and San Diego.

The train will be vestibuled throughout and lighted by Pintsch gas. Dining car and buffet will be managed by Mr. Fred Harvey. Dining car being always attached, patrons will be assured of regular meals at convenient hours.

No extra fare will be charged on the California Limited, but only first-class tickets will be honored.

The semi-weekly service will be in addition to regular daily California train, which carries both standard and tourist sleepers between Chicago and Los Angeles and between Chicago and San Francisco without change, on which all classes of tickets are honored.

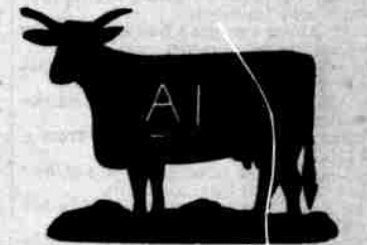
