Jewish "Rough Riders."

In his interview with Rev. Dr. Krauskopf on Cuban soil Colonel Roosevelt informed him of the exceptional valor of his eight "Rough Riders" of the Jewish faith. He said: "One of them, by name of Samuel Greenwald, from Prescott, Arizona, entered as a private on April 30, and is now second lieutenant, promoted for fighting by the side of Roosevelt for two days and nights under constant fire, amidst the most daring heroism. Colonel Roosevelt says that the nation has as much reason to be proud of them as he is. Another, by name of Samuel Goldberg, from Albuquerque, N. M., 22 years of age, was wounded in the hip, and for two days and nights continued fighting at Roosevelt's side, under murderous fire, with a bullet in his wound, which was not extracted until the fight was over. He showed me the mashed bullet. Another, by the name of Samuel Fishell, of Chicago, troop D, First cavalry regiment, is only 18 years old, and proved himself a brave lad."
