

New Equipment for the Santa Fe.

Not less than \$1,000,000 is to be expended by the Santa Fe for new equipment between now and November 15. This is the heaviest expenditure ever made by this company in so short a space of time, and the limited time of the contract illustrates the urgent need for the cars. Not later than November 15 the company will receive the following equipment: Fourteen dining cars, to cost not less than \$14,000 each; twenty passenger locomotives, to cost on an average of \$14,000 each; two composite cars, to cost \$7,700 each, and 500 refrigerator cars, to cost \$880 each. The refrigerator cars are needed to handle the constantly increasing Pacific Coast fruit traffic of the Santa Fe system.
