COMMERCIAL CONGRESS.

The Fifteenth Annual Session will be held October 25 to 29, 1904, at St. Louis.

The fifteenth session of the Trans-Mississippi Commercial Congress will meet at Saint Louis, Missouri, on the 25th day of October, 1904, at 10 a. m. in Convention hall, in response to the invitation at the 14th session of this organization held at Seattle, Washington, August 18-21, 1903, extended by the Honorable David R. Francis, President of the Louisiana Purchase Exposition.

In addition to the exercises commemorative of the Louisiana Purchase the executive committee submits a program of general interest to the people of the Trans-Mississippi states and territories, and among the subjects to be discussed are the following:

Rivers, water-ways and harbors, Isthmian canal, semi-arid regions, Merchant Marine, trade with the Orient, Consular service, statehood, railroad transportation, preservation of forests, sugar industry, trade with Mexico, exports and imports through Gulf and Pacific ports, encouragement of home manufactures, good roads and drainage, Lewis and Clark Exposition in 1905, department of mines and mining, trade with Canada, Alaska.

That immediate results may be obtained it is the desire of the executive committee that the requests made upon the Boards of Trade, Chambers of Commerce, industrial, maritime and other associations to appoint delegates be acted upon promptly, and the governors of states, mayors of cities and towns and the executive heads of county governments are respectfully requested to name delegates under the call as early as possible and forward the names with each address to the secretary.

URNS TO REPUBLICANISM.

Judge William H. Barnes of Tucson, Has a Change of Heart—Endorses Roosevelt.

The St. Louis Globe-Democrat in the issue of Sunday, September 18, published a 3,000 interview with Judge William H. Barnes of Arizona, who comes out for Roosevelt and gives his reasons therefor. Judge Barnes is a life long democrat, was appointed by President Cleveland a member of the Arizona supreme court and is now general counsel for the Greene Consolidated Copper company. The chief reason he gives for making the political change is that he believes the policies of the republican party are better for the country than the programme of the democratic party which really promises nothing beneficial.

The republican party, he says, is a party of action and accomplishment. The United States has grown great under its administration and Judge Barnes says that if any of the policies by which it has attained greatness had not been carried out its growth and prosperity would have been retarded. He believes that further prosperity depends upon the retention of the republican party in power.

Speaking of "safe and sane" democracy, Judge Barnes says that while it is an improvement upon Bryanism and populism, it offers to the country no reason why there should be a change of administration. There is nothing in the St. Louis platform, nothing in the speech of acceptance of Judge Parker to attract the independent voter, the businessman, the laborer or any other class of voters.

Judge Barnes pays a glowing tribute to President Roosevelt and especially commends him for his stand in the matter of reclamation of the arid lands.
